Dear Parents,

Welcome back to everyone for the last term on the year. As usual, it was delightful to see all the students and their fresh faces. Some have grown over the two weeks! The start of this term finds us in October, the month of the Holy Rosary and a significant month in our Marian tradition.

The Rosary is believed to have begun being prayed in the thirteenth century. It is widely believed that the Rosary began as a simple devotion and grew increasingly complex slowly over time. Meditation became a feature of the devotion when Dominic of Prussia (1382-1460), St Dominic, suggested reflecting on the life of Jesus during the prayer.



In fact, that is why the Rosary is meant to be prayed while reflecting on the great mysteries of the faith - the joyful, sorrowful, and glorious mysteries. Now we also have St John Paul's contribution, the Mysteries of Light. Those mysteries focus on the public life of Jesus. The Rosary is usually prayed in sets of five decades --that is one full recitation of a standard Rosary featuring fifty recitations of the Hail Mary. After each set of ten, the petitioner should pause and meditate. Which mystery is meditated upon depends on the day of the week, which determines whether the set. Over time, the Rosary has proven to be a powerful prayer and source of special intentions being answered. Whichever way you choose to pray, please find time to say a decade of the Rosary with your family this October.

By now you should have received this term's calendar which highlights the important dates, especially those at the end of the school year. Please note these dates, including the intensive swimming program which is a critical part of the Sport and PE curriculum.

Gospel Reflection

Mark 10:17-30



The Rich and the Kingdom of God

As Jesus started on his way, a man ran up to him and fell on his knees before him. “Good teacher,” he asked, “what must I do to inherit eternal life?” “Why do you call me good?” Jesus answered. “No one is good—except God alone. You know the commandments: ‘You shall not murder, you shall not commit adultery, you shall not steal, you shall not give false testimony, you shall not defraud, honour your father and mother.’” “Teacher,” he declared, “all these I have kept since I was a boy.”

Jesus looked at him and loved him. “One thing you lack,” he said. “Go, sell everything you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven. Then come, follow me.” At this the man’s face fell. He went away sad, because he had great wealth.

Jesus looked around and said to his disciples, “How hard it is for the rich to enter the kingdom of God!” The disciples were amazed at his words. But Jesus said again, “Children, how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is rich to enter the kingdom of God.” The disciples were even more amazed, and said to each other, “Who then can be saved?”

Jesus looked at them and said, “With man this is impossible, but not with God; all things are possible with God.”

Then Peter spoke up, “We have left everything to follow you!” “Truly I tell you,” Jesus replied, “no one who has left home or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or fields for me and the gospel will fail to receive a hundred times as much in this present age: homes, brothers, sisters, mothers, children and fields—along with persecutions—and in the age to come eternal life.

Reflection

‘How to inherit an eternal life’.

Mark’s Gospel this Sunday, discusses the question of ‘how to inherit eternal life’. A man approaches Jesus and wants to know what he needs to do to enter God’s Kingdom. Jesus tells the man that he must follow the Ten Commandments. The man responds, that he has been following these laws since he was young. Jesus then responds to the man and tells him he needs to give away all his material possessions to the poor and follow Him. The man is sad at this news because he is a rich man with many possessions and he is not willing to give his wealth away. In the Old Testament, wealth was seen as a sign of a blessing from God and the poor people were regarded as being cursed by God.

Mark’s Gospel is a story of vocation. Jesus uses this event to teach his followers about the dangerous trap of earthly possessions. To not judge a person on how much they earn, but how they treat others. He reminds his followers that salvation is a gift from God and to reach eternal life, our arms must be empty of materialistic possessions so we can receive God’s gift of grace and salvation.




We are running the first CaFE (Catholic Faith Exploration) course titled on Tuesday, **10th November 2015 in the old church building.**

Set in a café style environment, CaFE is fun and, at the same time, prayerful. There is opportunity for reflection and group discussion.







Lunch time clubs

2016 Parramatta Diocesan Team Sport Trials

Any Primary students enrolled in Year 5 and 6 in 2016 are invited to participate in the Parramatta Diocesan Team Sport Trials during Term Four in 2015 and Term One in 2016.

It is important to note that these trials are generally for those children who display an above average ability and/or have representative experience in their chosen sport. While teams are open in age it is **strongly recommended that only children of a representative standard in Years 5 & 6 in 2016 be invited to attend.**

Parramatta Diocesan trials will be held in the following sports:

*AFL (boys), Basketball (B&G), Cricket (B&G), Diving (B&G), Hockey (B&G), Football (B&G), Golf (B&G), Hockey (B&G), Netball (girls), Rugby League (11yrs & Opens), Rugby Union (boys), Softball (B&G), Tennis (B&G), & Touch (B&G).

To be eligible for selection for these trials an Online Team Registration Form must be completed that can be accessed via the website www.primarysportparra.catholic.edu.au. This online form is an **EXPRESSION OF INTEREST** for the 2016 Parramatta Diocesan Primary Sport Team trials. You may complete this form to attend a selection trial or if you have been selected in a representative squad or team. One form is to be completed per child, per individual sport. Each sport has its own criteria therefore, it is imperative that the correct form is completed.

Please note that your online registration is an **EXPRESSION OF INTEREST ONLY** and **MUST be approved by your child's school**. In order for your child to attend the nominated trial or event this may come down to the discretion of your school as to who is selected to attend the trial. In some sports only 2 students per school can be nominated. **Please complete all fields and especially "Representative Experience"**.

Your child's school will notify you one week prior to the trial date if your child is to attend to the Parramatta Diocesan trial for their selected sport by providing a trial information sheet.

Under no circumstances will a child be eligible to trial if the Online Registration Form has not been completed and approved by the school by the closing date.

Currently only the Summer Sports of BASKETBALL, CRICKET, SOFTBALL & TENNIS are open and registrations close on Friday 30th October as these trials will be held in November 2015. All other sport registrations will open on 2nd November for 2016 trials.

Diocesan Family Sunday: 18 October



Vocation Discernment Afternoon: 25 October





Do your children like to read the same book over and over? Great! Encourage them. Do they use more expression each time they read? Do they read more smoothly each time they read? Wonderful. Children need to learn to read fluently. This is difficult the first time they read a book but becomes easier the more times they read the same story. Teachers often say to children, “Read like you’re talking” One way for a child to do this is by becoming more familiar with a book, which is done by re-reading. So, when your child wants to read the same book again and again, smile and give praise. Your little reader is become more fluent.
