Gospel Reflection

Matthew 5:13-16

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

You are the light of the world.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'You are the salt of the earth. But if salt becomes tasteless, what can make it salty again? It is good for nothing, and can only be thrown out to be trampled underfoot by men. 'You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill-top cannot be hidden. No one lights a lamp to put it under a tub; they put it on the lamp-stand where it shines for everyone in the house. In the same way your light must shine in the sight of men, so that, seeing your good works, they may give the praise to your Father in heaven.'



Reflection

Today, when we describe a person as being the 'salt of the earth' it's generally meant in a way that says the person is hard working, straight talking and pretty down to earth. It's usually meant as a compliment but sometimes can come across as a bit condescending when used inappropriately. When Jesus tells the disciples that they are salt of the earth and the light of the world he is really saying 'You are to be the salt of the earth; you are to be the light of the world.' It is more of a directive than an affirmation of them.

To be salt of the earth and light of the world means to be the one who puts their hand up and steps forward to speak for, work for and act for those who are the least in this world. To have the potential and resources to be a force for good in the world and not act on it is to be like salt that's used for salting the streets or a lamp that's under a tub. Maths Assessment Interviews....

Over the past week, many of the students have participated in an MAI (Maths Assessment Interview). When conducted, these interviews provide the teacher with valuable information about your child's knowledge and strategies in four main areas of number: Counting, Place Value, Addition and Subtraction, Multiplication and Division. Rather than providing a specific 'score' or 'grade'; the teacher determines a 'Growth Point'; an entry point in which the teacher can then target specific learning tasks to meet the needs of all learners. These growth points are tracked throughout the year, ensuring that all students are accessing the numeracy curriculum at their point of need and therefore making the expected gains. Later in the year, you will be invited to attend a numeracy workshop, where you can learn more about the growth points and the implications for the classroom. Stay tuned....

School Fees

ROAD SAFETY & PARKING

ROAD SAFETY Each of us has a responsibility to model and teach children the dangers of walking through a car park, especially not walking behind cars reversing, as drivers cannot always see pedestrians. We have a rear to kerb parking rule in our car park, so the driver has a clear view when leaving. Consider and anticipate the movement of cars and point this out to your child.

Parking/Waiting Options:-

As many of our parents over the past year have found, it is often favourable to park over at Centenary Oval or Bruce Purser Reserve and either walk over to collect your child/ren, or have them meet you there. Often you have left the carpark, before many of our cars are out of our driveway and through the lights.

Another alternative is to approach the school from the netball court end of Wellgate Avenue (going down from Bentley Ave). There is a very large parking area down there adjacent to the bushland which could be used for those parents who choose to attend early and are happy to wait until it is time to move up into the carpark to collect their child/ren. Please consider using one of these options, in the hope that it may alleviate some of the frustrations and stress around pickup time.

Staggered pick-up times.

Because students inevitably arrive at the pickup zone at different times, PLEASE note the following advised pick up times.

- 3pm: ONLY KINDERGARTEN CHILDREN WITH NO SIBLINGS
- 3.10pm: Students Yr 1-3 with no older siblings
- 3.25 pm: This is the preferred time for picking up of students who are in Years 4-6 and their younger siblings, eg a family who has a kinder, a yr 3 and a yr 6 child

PLEASE EXIT BY THE SIDE GATE IN LINE WITH PEDESTRIAN CROSSING. This allows for much easier management of the students waiting in the drive through. We are VERY lucky to have the drive through option. Please observe these requests to avoid being sent back out to the street and onto the end of the queue. Overall, everyone does an excellent job and, together, we effectively clear the bulk of over 550 people in about 20 minutes. Thank you for your cooperation. ©

Please note that we are <u>unable</u> to supply a hat or any other item first thing in the morning from the office as the uniform shop is not in the admin building.

Skoolbag App

Our Skoolbag app is a way of informing you of upcoming events or cancellation due to the weather, results from carnivals and gala days, giving updates while students are on excursions and other important information about major events within the school.

We have a large portion of the school already using this app. If you do not have the app it is free to download. To install it, just search for our school name "Our Lady of the Angels Primary Rouse Hill" in either the Apple App Store, or Google Play Store.



There are many benefits to having this app on your device:

- You may select to receive notification for your child's grade only.
- Absentee notes can be completed on this app.
- Access to newsletters and news events linked directly to our school website.
- Instant notification when excursions are postponed, assemblies cancelled due to bad weather, delays during excursions and other important information.
- Online permission notes in the future.

If you already have this app, it is up to you to update your settings to receive the correct push notifications. To update this click the "More" button on the bottom right of the app, then "Setup Push Notifications". Turn on the Push categories that are applicable for you by tapping the on/off switch. You will receive alerts specific to the selected grade and all alerts sent as a whole school.

Our School is a Nut Aware School Community

At Our Lady of the Angels School, we have children who have severe allergies to nuts. While allergic reactions are common and most are not serious, for these children the reaction can be life-threatening. This is called anaphylaxis and can occur in minutes of an exposure to a trigger, in these children's case, nuts.

We see prevention as a major part of providing a safe environment for these children. So as to support our community's effort in this regard, we kindly ask that parents avoid preparing snacks for recess or lunch that include Nutella spread, any peanut butter, nut spreads, snack bars and biscuits that contain nuts. <u>Products having the statement may contain 'traces of nuts'</u> are suitable to bring to school.

We also ask that you **do not** include foods that contain nuts when providing food for special events such as cake days or morning teas.

Literacy News

Handwriting Textbook

This year the students again will receive a handwriting textbook. Students will have weekly handwriting lessons to assist in developing writing fluency and correct letter formation.

Words of the Week

This year our school's literacy goal is for all students to use richer vocabulary and develop skills and strategies to improve learning and memory of spelling words.
