As Catholics, our mission is to help build a world of justice and love. This is the focus of next Sunday's Gospel. One of the most important roles as parents is to model that behaviour . Children will accept any outcome and consequence as long as it is established as fair. This is something reiterated repeatedly with students and staff. Sometimes, after a holiday break, it is hard for some students to settle back into or to find their place in 'the order of things'. This leads to unnecessary anxiety

that may have arisen but focus on the positive as there *is* much to celebrate. *If you have any concern, your child's teacher is the first point of contact. This is appreciated.* **Reminders**

The first is the <u>Parent Information Night</u> (no children). This is a 30 minute briefing on the routines and expectations of your child's new grade and is hosted by his/her teacher. This will be held on Wednesday 12th February with Kinder to Y2 commencing at 6.30pm and the Yr 3-6 starting at 7pm. This is an important opportunity to find out the answers to the 'little' day to day things – it is NOT a time to discuss your child with the teacher. It is an expectation that at least one parent will attend this session and will be very helpful to you, especially if it is a grade not experienced previously.

Morning Drop Off/Afternoon Drive Through Pick Up

This year, OLA will have over 400 students. This means that the morning drop off and afternoon pick up will be an even greater challenge. In the morning with parents rushing off to work, etc, patience is especially needed to be exercised so please allow time for this and remember to keep within the speed limit of **10KPM**. This is a reminder that <u>KINDERGARTEN PARENTS ONLY</u> are expected in the drive through <u>before</u> 3.10pm. Please do not arrive in the <u>drive through</u> before this time if you have any children in any other grades. This includes parents of kinder students with older siblings. In fact, we are suggesting that, if any of your children are in Grades 3 to 6, please arrive around 3.20pm and not before. From the beginning of 2014, anyone arriving out of these times may be asked to exit and return to the back of the queue. Also, please display your name card on the PASSENGER SUNVISOR upon entering the drive through. Please don't wait till you have arrived at the pick-up point as students' names need to be called well before this to ensure a smooth flow. If you don't have a name card, simply make one by writing your surname large and clear in black on white card.

We are very fortunate to have this drive through/pick up facility and, given the numbers of students and cars, the process works very well with everyone's cooperation and patience.

Thank you to Mrs Byrne who assisted the morning traffic flow by acting as a 'lollypop' person. This was a big help and we are appealing to anyone who can give 10 minutes in the morning or the afternoon to control the flow of pedestrians and cars during the 10 minute peak periods. This is only on the school grounds. A high visibility vest will be provided and a 'lollypop'. If you are able to assist, please contact the P&F or the school by email with 'lollypop person' in the subject line. The more people we get, the

easier it will be and we can draw up a weekly roster.

Book Club

Next week, Bookclub will be going home to years 1-6. If you wish to place an order for Bookclub, please return your order by Tuesday 18th February. **Payment can only be made by cheque or as an online payment by credit card**. You must write the receipt number on the Bookclub order form before returning it to school. **No cash can be accepted** for Bookclub.

For those new to 'school life', Bookclub is sent out twice a term. It is not an expectation that books are purchased each or any time. This is just another avenue for you to purchase books for home, often at a good price.

Please Note: No late orders will be accepted. If your order does come in late, it will be kept in the office until the next order goes in.

Important:-

Just a reminder that we discourage the children from bringing any electronic games, iphones etc, to school. If for any reason your child needs to bring a phone to school, a letter must be supplied to the principal explaining the reason, and also it must be kept in the office during school hours. No phones or electronic games should be in a child's bag, at all, during the day, as they will become very distressed if they are damaged or lost. Thank you for assisting us in this matter.

From the Office....

Thank you to all parents for your patience during the first weeks of school. The office desk and phone is often at its busiest at this time of year and so I do appreciate your patience.

Just a few reminders:-

Notes/money for the Office - Each morning teachers will ask the children in their class if they have any notes or money. Teachers will keep any information they require and will send any other notes or money to the office via the class note bag. This system allows the office to receive notes and money without parents being required to actually come into the school. It also helps the children develop responsibility for passing on information.

<u>Change of Details</u> - It is <u>critical</u> that the school has up-to-date contact details for all students at all times. Please ensure that any phone, address or contact details that change are relayed to the office as a matter of urgency. It is most distressing for children and staff if we are unable to contact parents in the case of a child being ill or injured.

<u>Uniforms</u> - The uniform shop is open on <u>Tuesday mornings from 8.15am - 9.30am</u>. If you need to come in to purchase uniforms, please do so at this time. Otherwise please either phone or email your order through and we will get it ready for easy collection from the office.

<u>Lost Property</u> - Any items that are found are place in the lost property bin behind the office, or returned to the class if there is a name on it. In this regard, could you <u>PLEASE</u> ensure that all items, particularly hats, jumpers/jackets are labelled. You would be amazed at how many items we find, even at the beginning of the year with no names. Please check your child's bag regularly and if you find an item that does not belong to them, please return it the following day to the class teacher.

<u>Sick Bay Clothing</u> – If your child needs to be changed and spare clothes come home, please wash and return them to the office as soon as possible (even the sock and underwear).

<u>Visiting the School</u> - A reminder that during school hours, ALL parents, visitors and classroom helpers **MUST** sign in at the front office and collect a Visitors Sticker and then sign out as they leave the school, even if it is at the end of the day.

Late/Early Leavers - If your child is late for school or needs to be collected early, you must attend the office and fill out the Late/Early Leavers Slip. If, for some reason your child is out of school for <u>two hours</u> or more in any one day, eg arrives at school after 10.45am or is collected before 1pm, there is a new requirement for reporting these partial absences. You are now also required to fill out the book at the front desk and this information will be collated and forwarded to the Department of Education throughout the year.

<u>School Fees</u> - All families should have received their school fees by now. <u>Please Note</u> that the swim program fee is not included on the account at this stage, as well as the year 5/6 Canberra excursion. These two fees will be billed in Term 2 and will need to be paid in addition to the flexible payment plan. If you have any queries at all about the fees, please do not hesitate to contact Mrs Goldsworthy.

<u>Medication</u> - If your child needs medication at school, new medication forms will need to be completed and given to Mrs Goldsworthy in the office. Please see me if you need to discuss anything, or you need the forms. No medication is to be kept in your child's school bag.

<u>Emails</u> - Please remember to add your child's class to all emails, especially absent notes. With 400 students at the school now, this saves me a lot of time looking up classes.

<u>ICAS</u>

Attached to this newsletter is the form for ICAS competitions. These are voluntary competitions held from term 2 in the areas of Writing, Spelling, English, Computer Studies, Science and Mathematics. Some of the competitions are open to year 2 students this year. All information regarding costs and arrangements are in the attached letter, which needs to be returned with the required money to the office by 4th April. On Wednesday August 27th, OLA will take part with 4 other schools in a Creative Arts Festival at Evans Theatre, Penrith. Children will need to audition for this event. They are being asked to express their interest in the performance, through this Google doc. We are asking parents to complete the survey to provide us with their children's experience in performing and dancing.

We welcome all children from OLA to audition. It is not compulsory that children attend a dance school to audition, as all children who are interested are encouraged to audition. We will be choosing 50 students to perform in the Creative Arts festival 2014. As this event is held every 2 - 3 years, if your child is not chosen there will be other opportunities to participate in the future.

The first auditions will be held on Wednesday 12th Feb for students for Years 3-6. Students will be then called back for a second audition on Friday 14th Feb. We will then advertise the dates for auditions Years K-2 in the newsletter. Once all auditions have been completed, children will be notified if they have been successful in the auditions.

From the Classroom of 5/6B & 5/6W

Stage 3 has had a wonderful start to the school year! In Week 2, we went on an excursion to Minnamurra Falls where we saw the different layers of the rainforest and walked nearly five kilometres to see the beautiful waterfall. We are now ready to begin our Rainforest unit in class.









The School Banking program includes an exciting Rewards Program designed to encourage children to get into the habit of making regular saving. Every time your child makes a deposit at school they receive a silver coloured Dollarmites token. The first token will be received upon the first deposit at school. Once your child has individually saved 10 tokens they can redeem them for an exclusive Dollarmites reward item. Students will have lots of fun saving their tokens for these cool rewards items.

Taking part in School Banking is easy.

- If your child has an existing Commonwealth Bank Youthsaver account they can start banking straight away. They just need to bring their deposit in every week using their Dollarmites deposit wallet. If your child has misplaced their Dollarmites deposit book or deposit wallet, they can request a new one from either the local branch or contact the School Banking Co-ordinator.
- If your child does not have a Youthsaver account, you can open one at any Commonwealth Bank branch, no forms to fill in! Remember to take in identification for you and your child (such as drivers license and birth certificate), you will receive a Dollarmites wallet and deposit book on the spot and be able to start banking on the next business day it is that easy!
- School Banking packs will be sent home with kindergarten today. If you would like your child to receive a pack from another grade, please email the office and one will be sent home.
- Bank books need to be sent in to school on Wednesdays and will be forwarded home on Thursdays. Banking will commence next week, ie 13th February.

Social Skills

Our social skills program begins next week. Each theme goes for a fortnight and is addressed in the classroom and during assemblies. Parents are asked to support the Social Skills program by discussing and reinforcing each fortnightly concept.

The first social skill to be addressed is:

Greeting others.

Look at the person, smile at them and say, "hello". Remember to use the person's name if you know it.
