Dear Parents,

This week has found everyone in the community settling into their routine. Most significantly, on Monday we welcomed our new Kindergarten students for 2015. What a great group of students they are! Changes to the Calendar

Mark 1:29-39 Jesus cures Simon's mother-in-law and many others as well.

This week's Gospel completes a picture of Jesus' ministry: preaching, curing the sick, driving out demons, and then moving on to continue this work in another place. Mark's Gospel tells us that Jesus did this throughout Galilee.

Jesus' compassion and healing of the sick is a sign of the Kingdom of God. The Church continues to extend Christ's healing presence to others in its ministry to the sick. In the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, the Church prays for spiritual and physical healing, forgiveness of sins, and comfort for those who are suffering from illness. We know from last week's Gospel that Jesus gathered and prayed with the community in the synagogue. Today we learn that Jesus also took the time to pray alone. Following the example of Jesus, we also pray together with our community, and we take the time to pray alone. Our children observe our prayer with others. We might want to take the opportunity to talk with them about our private prayer, however, so that through our example, they may learn to make private prayer an important part of their daily lives.

Gather as a family and talk about the ways in which your family prays together (at Mass, grace before meals, bedtime prayers). FEAST OF THE WEEK: PRESENTATION OF THE LORD 2nd FEBRUARY.

Forty days after Jesus was born, Mary and Joseph brought him to the great Temple in Jerusalem. There they presented Baby Jesus to the Heavenly Father. That was the Jewish law. The Holy Family obeyed it with loving hearts. This was a very popular feast called Candlemas in past centuries and candles were blessed and carried in procession, to show the entry of Jesus as the light of the world. While they were in the Temple, Mary also attended the Purification ceremony, which was another custom. After the birth of their children, all Jewish mothers

were supposed to go to the Temple for this ceremony. Mary did her duty cheerfully. She teaches us to be humble and obedient as she was.

A holy old priest of the Temple named Simeon learned from God that the Infant Jesus was truly the Saviour. He held Mary's Son Jesus in his arms with joy and awe. "My own eyes are looking at my salvation," he exclaimed. God allowed him recognise Jesus as the Saviour and Simeon put his trust in the little Child. Imagine what Mary and Joseph were thinking. Then, inspired by God, Simeon told Mary that she would have to suffer very much. He was talking about the terrible pain our Blessed Mother would feel when Jesus died on the cross.

Information Evening

This coming Wednesday evening, there will be an information session in your child's learning space. If your child is in Kindergarten, Year1 or Year 2, this will commence at 6.30pm. If your child is in Year 3, 4 or 5/6, this will commence at 7 pm. If you have a clash of times, it is advisable that you go to the session of your oldest child as this will be new information. Please keep in mind that this is general information about the procedures and expectations, not a time for individual questions about your child. In Week 9, there will be Student/Teacher/Parent Conferences which will be an opportunity to celebrate the learning gains and areas to improve. In the meantime, if you need to have a meeting with your child's teacher, please contact the office via email or phone to arrange an appointment.

Please Speak Up.

Clear and open communication is the key to successful relationships and so it is in this school community. If you have any issue or concern, no matter how trivial you think it may be, please do not hesitate to phone me or drop an email to the school so that it can be clarified. The sooner this is done the better. Often, something trivial is innocently discussed out of context among parents and the matter becomes a source of unnecessary anxiety. I would hope that, if you were approached about something to which you have no answer that you respond with, 'Call the school and ask them'. Thanks for your understanding and cooperation.

Some housekeeping reminders:

- If there is a need to pick up your child early, please DO NOT CALL THE OFFICE to call your child. They will be called only when a parent has arrived to collect them.
- Supervision before school does not begin until 8.20am. In the interest of your child's safety, please do not allow him/her to enter the school grounds through the small gate adjacent to OOSH.
- When collecting your child after school, please wait in the COLA area or the basketball court;
- When using the drive-through, please display your name on the passenger side sun visor. It is not possible to read a name that is flat on the dash board
- Please remember that the area from the church to outside the school office is no parking during the morning drop off and afternoon pick up times.

Bus Passes

We have been advised by Hillsbus that if you live within the 2.3km radius (as the crow flys) but your direct walking route is more than 2km, then there is a good possibility that your application will be approved. You will need to forward a letter with your application stating that this is the situation.

If you applied at the end of last year and you were not successful, then please ask for a new application form and resubmit.

No Parking means No Parking

You can stop in a No Parking zone for a maximum of 2mins to drop off or pick up passengers. You must stay within 3 metres of your vehicle. You cannot leave your car!

The penalty for parking in a NO Parking zone is \$147 and 2 demerit points.

Have you completed your Child Protection for Volunteers Training??



School Banking

This is a reminder that school banking books should be sent to the office, via the class notebag, on <u>Wednesdays</u>. The banking is done early on Thursday morning and the books then returned to the students. If you would like your child to commence banking, please email the office and we will be able to send home a pack for you. If you child is new to our school and participated in school banking at their previous school, please be aware that they are able to still bank us with, the banking ladies just need to give them a new school number when their book comes in.

Many hands make light work.

Once again, we are asking for assistance with the morning and afternoon traffic flow by parents/carers acting as a 'lollypop' person. This was a big help last year and we are appealing to anyone who can give 10 minutes in the morning or the afternoon to control the flow of pedestrians and cars during the 10 minute peak periods. This is only on the school grounds. A high visibility vest will be provided and a 'lollypop'. If you are able to assist, please contact the P&F or the school by email with 'lollypop person' in

the subject line. The more people we get, the easier it will be and we can draw up a weekly roster.

UNIFORM - PLEASE NOTE...

This is a reminder to you so that you can support us in ensuring students are looking smart and 'uniform'...

Shoes are 'black leather lace up or velco- not dress shoes (girls) and not black sport shoes.

Girls' headwear is navy, teal or white ribbon or the school scrunchie or headband – not fancy flowers, etc Summer white socks are <u>not the sports anklet socks</u> but ankle socks that finish <u>above</u> the ankle bone.

Sports shoes are to be white or predominantly white.

School bag is the regulation navy school bag provided by the school, please.

The tracksuit top is only to be worn with sports uniform. The navy jumper or bomber jacket is to be worn with the summer/winter uniform.

Social Skill

The social skill program aims to equip children with the appropriate skills to function successfully in society. Many of these skills parents teach naturally to children in everyday life. The aim of our school based social skill program is to focus specifically on a skill each fortnight. We talk about and model this skill at assembly and in the classroom. We also communicate it each fortnight in the newsletter so that parents can follow through with it at home.

The social skill for this fortnight is:-

Greeting others – Look at the person, smile, say hello using their name.

Student Attendance - NEW GUIDELINES!!

As part of the implementation of the National Standards, holidays taken by students outside of school vacation periods will now be included as absences. A Certificate of Exemption can no longer be granted for this purpose.

Families are encouraged to holiday or travel during school vacations. If travel during school term is necessary the following considerations apply:

- Leave of ten (10) or more school days will require a formal application for leave in writing. This
 letter of request should be addressed to the Principal prior to commencing the leave period
 indicating the specific reason or purpose for the request of leave.
- If the principal accepts the reason for the absence, the absence will be marked as leave.
- If the principal does not believe the absence is in the student's best interests and does not accept the reason, the absence is unjustified and will be recorded as **Absent.**
- Partial Absences will be counted in the morning from any time after 8.50am. Any students
 arriving at school after 8.50am must report to the school office accompanied by an adult to
 complete the necessary documentation.

From the Office....

Thank you to all parents for your patience during the first week of school. The office desk and phone is often at its busiest at this time of year and so we do appreciate your patience.

Just a few reminders:-

Notes/money for the Office - Each morning teachers will ask the children in their class if they have any notes or money. Teachers will keep any information they require and will send any other notes or money to the office via the class note bag. This system allows the office to receive notes and money without parents being required to actually come into the school. It also helps the children develop responsibility for passing on information.

<u>Change of Details</u> - It is <u>critical</u> that the school has up-to-date contact details for all students at all times. Please ensure that any phone, address or contact details that change are relayed to the office as a matter of urgency. It is most distressing for children and staff if we are unable to contact parents in the case of a child being ill or injured.

<u>Uniforms</u> - The uniform shop is open on <u>Tuesday mornings from 8.15am - 9.30am</u>. If you need to come in to purchase uniforms, please do so at this time. Otherwise please either phone or email your order through and we will get it ready for easy collection from the office. Please do not come to the office counter before or after school requesting uniform, as it is not directly on hand. You can put an order in and pay for it at that time and we will send it home with your child, either that day or the following.

<u>Visiting the School</u> - A reminder that during school hours, <u>ALL</u> parents, visitors and classroom helpers <u>MUST</u> sign in at the front office and collect a Visitors Sticker and then sign out as they leave the school, even if it is at the end of the day.

<u>Late/Early Leavers</u> - If your child is late for school or needs to be collected early, you must attend the office and fill out the Late/Early Leavers Slip. If there is a need to pick up your child early, please **DO NOT CALL THE OFFICE** to ask that your child is ready for when you get here. They will be called only when a parent has arrived to collect them. This is in the interest of minimising work in what is already a very busy office and in reducing the amount of lost learning time for your child.

<u>Photography</u> - Photos of the students are often placed on our website and occasionally in the local newspapers. If for any reason you do not wish for your child to have their photo displayed in this manner, please advise the office in writing.

<u>School Fees</u> - All families should receive their school fees by the end of week 3. Once again the Flexible Payment Plan (FPP) is being offered to parents as an alternative to the current payment term of 30 days. Please see the information below regarding this option. If you have any queries at all about the fees, please do not hesitate to contact Mrs Goldsworthy.

<u>Medication</u> - If your child needs medication at school, new medication forms will need to be completed and given to Mrs Goldsworthy in the office. Please see me if you need to discuss anything, or you need the forms. No medication is to be kept in your child's school bag.

Student's Birthday

As the grades are becoming larger, we ask that if you send a treat in for your child's birthday that you only send enough for his/her class (not the whole grade). Also if you are sending in ice blocks, you will need to drop them at the office at about $\underline{1.30pm}$ as we don't have enough room in our freezer to keep them frozen throughout the morning. Cupcakes can be left at the office in the morning.


OLA Swimming Carnival – Tuesday 3rd February










FROM THE CLASSROOM: Year 5/6W


