Dear Parents,

This has been a very busy and eventful week.

Thank you to the parents who attended the workshop on Managing Anxiety. One of key messages was that anxiety is a very normal and necessary emotion for us to have as part of our growing and learning and for our survival. However, often students present as excessively so and, after the information session, we can recognise many cases where this may be exacerbated by parents' unreasonable and unnecessary levels of anxiety impacting their children. The key message for us all is to focus on 'the now'. Thoughts about 'what could happen' are just thoughts, not facts, thoughts which can be damaging and counter-productive. Something else to consider, which I have flagged in the past, we all know how stressful mornings can begetting out of bed on time, dressed, breakfast, that home reader that cannot be found, etc. etc., not to mention getting yourself ready for work. These all lead to patience being tested. Sometimes, we can do things and speak out of turn and unknowingly upset our child. It is possible you drop your child at school and not think another thing of it but some children carry that stress, despair and anxiety with them for the rest of the day - worried about you and your relationship. This invariably impacts on their ability to focus. Remember to always 'make things right' with your child – a hug and a kiss and an 'I love you'- before you drop them for their day.

This session aligned with our focus this year on Wellbeing and improved Mental Health. We are all created in God's image and have responsibility to ourselves to be the best we can be to continue Jesus' mission to bring love and justice to the world. We hope this was an opportunity to help some of you and, in turn, your children.

We are still looking for 7 FAMILIES to host <u>Japanese Students</u> (aged around 11 years).

To host a student, your own children can be of any age. Also, KTOOSH have confirmed that they will accommodate any of their families billeting Japanese students.

This has been a regular practice over the past years. OLA School acts as host to students from Nanzan Christian School in Japan. The students have always proven to be very polite and grateful and it has been a wonderful experience for the host family as well as their guests.

The following is the program:

26th July 2017 (Wed): Arr. OLA Primary School and meet host families (15:20)

27th (Thurs): Integrated program (at school) 28th (Fri): Integrated program (at school)

29th (Sat): Free with host families

30th (Sun): Group visiting SVD church in Marsfield (11:00-13:00- dropped at OLA grounds at 10.30am)

31st (Mon): Integrated program (at school)

1st Aug (Tue): Integrated program (at school), farewell depart (from school) at 13:00 approx

It is preferred that these children are billeted in twos and have their own room. The host family will receive \$40 x 6 nights = \$240 (per students) X 2 students = \$480 per family

If you are interested in considering hosting a couple of students, please email the school with 'Japanese' in the subject line. Families selected will be 'first in' basis.

We are looking forward to sharing in this rich cultural experience once again.

Peer Review

Each year schools undergo a thorough and rigorous compliance process, conducted by Catholic Education Parramatta (CEDP), in line with NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA). This involves a process whereby colleagues, teacher educators and other CEDP Team Leaders review and critique documentation ensuring mandatory school compliance. On Tuesday our Stage 1 teachers were asked to present documentation, (teaching program, annotations, evaluations, scope and sequences, assessment plans, work samples, assessment samples, mark books and records of achievement) in the two nominated areas of Science and English.

I cannot begin to tell you how extremely thankful and proud I am of our staff. Our Stage 1 teachers have worked collaboratively and tirelessly ensuring that all the required documentation was made available and organised in such a way that resulted in an outstanding presentation to our colleagues from other schools.

The feedback that we received was amazing and a just reward, affirming of the great work that takes place at OLA in every classroom. We received numerous commendations not only about the mandatory requirements but also about the quality of teaching practices evident in our school. Despite our teachers wanting recommendations and some ideas for future direction, (as we are always looking to do things better) the reviewing schools could not think of any recommendations, such was the comprehensive presentation from our team.

I know that the parent community join me in showing appreciation to the outstanding teachers at OLA. Their commitment and dedication to getting the best learning outcomes from your children is second to none and I would like to express my gratitude and thanks to all the teachers for going over and beyond expectations for the OLA students.

REMINDER.... Official school hours for supervision start at 8.20am and finish at 3.40pm. Leaving children before this time means they are unsupervised. Many children are being dropped as early at 8am. This is unfair and unsafe. For this reason, I have asked any children at school early to sit quietly and pray in the church and wait until the gates open.

Lately I have noticed some of the children gathered and sitting on the sidewalk and kerb outside on Wellgate Ave. I have concerns about their safety here. PLEASE, if you need to drop your child before the gates open, OOSH is available. At the very least, speak to them about the expectation of waiting *quietly* in the church. Either way, there is no supervision by the school before 8.20am.

I thank you for your understanding and cooperation in the interest of your child's safety.
