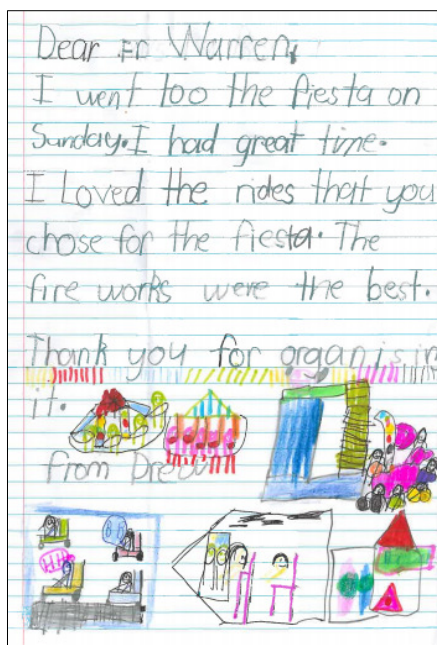


Dear Parents,

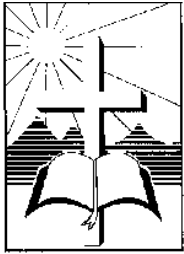

Gospel Reflection

Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year A

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew 14:22-33

Jesus made the disciples get into the boat and go on ahead to the other side while he would send the crowds away. After sending the crowds away he went up into the hills by himself to pray. When evening came, he was there alone, while the boat, by now far out on the lake, was battling with a heavy sea, for there was a head-wind. In the fourth watch of the night he went towards them, walking on the lake, and when the disciples saw him walking on the lake they were terrified. 'It is a ghost' they said, and cried out in fear. But at once Jesus called out to them, saying, 'Courage! It is I! Do not be afraid.' It was Peter who answered. 'Lord,' he said 'if it is you, tell me to come to you across the water.' 'Come' said Jesus. Then Peter got out of the boat and started walking towards Jesus across the water, but as soon as he felt the force of the wind, he took fright and began to sink. 'Lord! Save me!' he cried. Jesus put out his hand at once and held him. 'Man of little faith,' he said 'why did you doubt?' And as they got into the boat the wind dropped. The men in the boat bowed down before him and said, 'Truly, you are the Son of God.'

In the Gospel this weekend, Jesus calls the disciples and calms their fears. They are seeking proof that it is actually Jesus before them. Peter's fear and doubt overtake him but Jesus reaches out and saves him. When Jesus and Peter enter the boat, the wind stops and the disciples confess Jesus as the Son of God.

Faith in Jesus allowed the disciples to do His work. Peter walked on water. Thousands of people were fed with five loaves and two fish. When Peter has doubts about Jesus, he falters in his service of the Kingdom of Heaven. Just like Peter, we need to ensure that our Christian ministry emerges from the faith that Jesus is the Messiah. We must put complete faith in Jesus and allow him to come alive within our hearts and our interactions with people.

This weekend with your family... The mission of the Church is to continue the work of Jesus. The family, the domestic church, participates in this mission too. Talk about how your family participates in the mission of the Church. Discuss ways in which you seek to reach out to your neighbours and people in need through acts of kindness, mercy, and justice. Pray together that Jesus will continue to work through your family to prepare the kingdom of heaven – like I'm sure he already is!

Saint of the Week: St. Mary of the Cross MacKillop

Feast Day: August 8th

“Never see a need without doing something about it”



Each week we have been looking at the life of a different Saint. This week we are celebrating the feast day of a saint close to our hearts. St. Mary of the Cross MacKillop is Australia's first saint. She did a lot of work setting up Catholic Schools for children to attend. At the start of the week I challenged the children to live their life like Mary MacKillop and to 'not see a need without doing something about it'. Even the smallest acts of kindness and charity can make a big difference. Please continue to encourage your children to reach out to others and this is best shown with you leading by example. Thank you Mrs Hurst and Mrs Myer and all of Year 2 for preparing such a beautiful liturgy for us this afternoon. On January 15, 1842 Mary MacKillop was born of Scottish parents in Fitzroy, Victoria. A plaque in the footpath now marks the place of her birth in Brunswick Street, Fitzroy.

Mary, the eldest of eight children, was well educated by her father who spent some years studying for the priesthood in Rome but through ill health had returned to his native Scotland until 1835 when he migrated to Australia with his parents. Unfortunately, he lacked financial awareness, so the family was often without a home of their own, depending on friends and relatives and frequently separated from one another. From the age of sixteen, Mary earned her living and greatly supported her family, as a governess, as a clerk and as a teacher at the Portland school. While acting as a governess to her uncle's children at Penola, Mary met Father Julian Tenison Woods who, with a parish of 22,000 square miles/56,000 square kilometres, needed help in the religious education of children in the outback. At the time Mary's family depended on her income so she was not free to follow her dream. However, in 1866, greatly inspired and encouraged by Father Woods, Mary opened the first Saint Joseph's School in a disused stable in Penola.

Young women came to join Mary, and so the Congregation of the Sisters of St Joseph was begun. In 1867, Mary was asked by Bishop Shiel to come to Adelaide to start a school. From there, the Sisters spread, in groups to small outback settlements and large cities around Australia, New Zealand, and now in Peru, Brazil and refugee camps of Uganda and Thailand. Mary and these early Sisters, together with other Religious Orders and Lay Teachers of the time, had a profound influence on the forming of Catholic Education as we have come to know and experience it today. She also opened Orphanages, Providences to care for the homeless and destitute both young and old, and Refuges for ex-prisoners and ex-prostitutes who wished to make a fresh start in life.

Throughout her life, Mary met with opposition from people outside the Church and even from some of those within it. In the most difficult of times she consistently refused to attack those who wrongly accused her and undermined her work, but continued in the way she believed God was calling her and was always ready to forgive those who wronged her. Throughout her life Mary suffered ill health. She died on August 8, 1909 in the convent in Mount Street, North Sydney where her tomb is now enshrined. This great Australian woman inspired great dedication to God's work in the then new colonies. In today's world, she stands as an example of great courage and trust in her living out of God's loving and compassionate care of those in need.

Preventing Anxiety and Victimisation through
education



Our school has agreed for your school to take part in PAVe, an exciting new research project taking place in NSW and WA primary schools. The purpose of the project is to evaluate two interventions that enhance students' social and emotional learning and foster the prevention of bullying behaviours (*Friendly Schools Plus* and *Cool Kids: Taking Control*). **Grades 3 and 4 students** are being invited to participate by completing a **confidential** survey on four occasions over the next three years. Your school will implement *Cool Kids: Taking Control*.

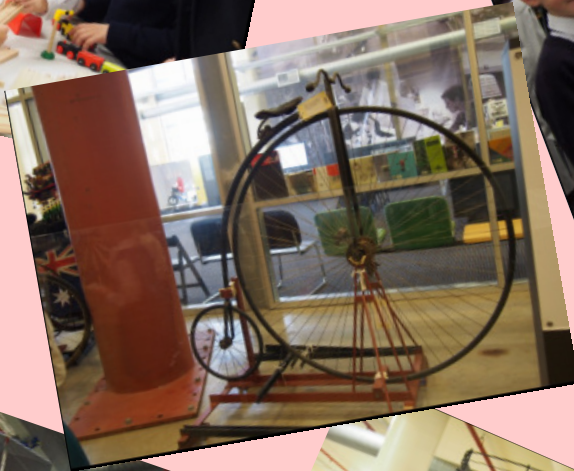
We would like to wish the students representing Our Lady of the Angels in the Hills Zone Athletics Carnival next week.
