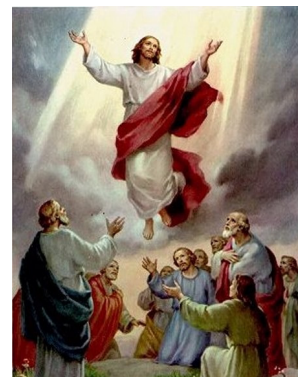


## Dear Parents,

Each week, we celebrate the birthday of the students in our community. This Sunday is a very important birthday for us, as Catholics, as it is the Feast of Pentecost, the first day of the Church on earth.

Jesus came to bring us the message of love and justice as the Kingdom of God. He brought us the hope salvation and eternal life through His teachings, His works, His suffering and death but most significantly through His resurrection. After forty days He ascended into Heaven, remembered last Sunday.

Jesus asked that His disciples continue His work to spread the Word and bring the message of hope for eternal life to all people. Jesus knew of the fears and apprehensions held by the disciples and, for this reason, He promised to send 'a helper' to assist them with this task.



*"I will ask the Father, and He will give you another Helper, that He may be with you forever; that is the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it does not see Him or know Him, but you know Him because He abides with you and will be in you."*

*John 14:-16-17*

On Pentecost Sunday, this helper came in the form of the Holy Spirit rendering the disciples with the courage, wisdom, right judgment and many other gifts and fruits to continue the work left to them by Jesus.

For over two thousand years, the 'baton has been passed' to all those baptised to continue and today that baton is in our hands. Through Baptism, the Spirit abides in us also. It is an awesome responsibility but one that brings hope and great joy to others.

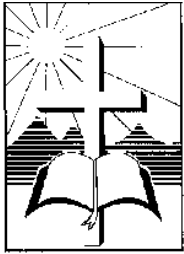
## Priest's, Principals' and RECs' Conference.

On Thursday, a large gathering was held at Parramatta as part of the Faith in Our Future, Five Year Plan for Parramatta Diocese. The main topic was examining the findings from the survey conducted recently. This was to gather feedback from a cross-section of members across the diocese- teaching staff, parishioners, students and clergy. The good message was that, in Parramatta, we do what we do very well in terms of developing Catholicity compared with other diocese across the country. Children were able to express their connection with God and their faith.

Having said this, there are key concerns such as school, not the family, being the place where faith development occurs. For many, when they leave school, there is a void and a decline in lived faith when not connected with practising community. This reiterates the importance of the connection between parish, school and family.

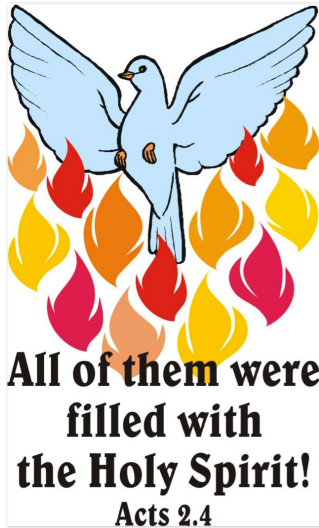


## Pentecost Cycle, Year A

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John 20:19-23

*On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."*

The Season of Easter concludes with today's celebration, the Feast of Pentecost. On Pentecost we celebrate the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles gathered in the upper room in Jerusalem; this event marks the beginning of the Church. The actual recount of the Pentecost event is told in the First Reading for this Sunday, from the Acts of the Apostles. Our Gospel also recounts how Jesus gave His disciples the Holy Spirit after rising from the dead. He was fulfilling His promise to send a helper to be his witness throughout the world.



Jesus greets his disciples with the gift of peace. Jesus then commissions his disciples to continue the work that he has begun, "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." He breathes the Holy Spirit upon the disciples and sends them to continue his work of reconciliation through the forgiveness of sins.

This Gospel reminds us that the Church is called to be a presence in the world. The presence of Christ is celebrated in the Church's sacramental life. In the Sacrament of Baptism, we are cleansed of sin and become a new creation in Christ. In the Sacrament of Penance, the Church celebrates the mercy of God through the forgiving of sins.

### Talk to your children...

Pentecost is sometimes called the birthday of the Church. The Gospel for Pentecost reminds us that the Church begins with the command to forgive. Within our families, we learn how to forgive and how to accept forgiveness. The gift of the Holy Spirit enables us to do both. Encourage your children to be the witness of Jesus in today's world through their forgiveness. It would be a great opportunity for everybody in the family to attend the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

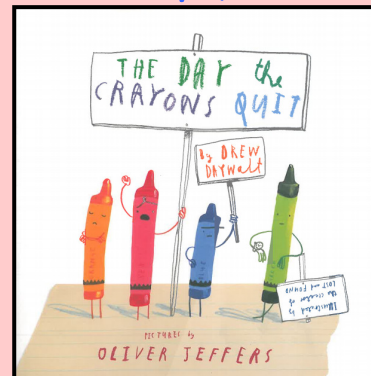
It's me Ana, I got your letter and I am very sorry for using you too much. But you see now I'm using black more often, but I will calm down on how much I use you!
