Dear Parents,

Last Monday, staff gathered for our annual Formation and Reflection Day. The focus of the day was the text, 'Forming Intentional Disciples' by Sherry Weddell.

In our role as members of a Catholic school staff, we have the privileged opportunity and responsibility to bring our students into relationship with Jesus Christ. Weddell talks about the *five thresholds of conversion* –

Initial Trust, Spiritual Curiosity, Spiritual Openness, Spiritual Seeking, Intentional Discipleship. Each of us is at a different threshold in our faith journey. This is only normal. At times we encounter challenges that may send us backward. However, wherever we are, we are mandated to take the steps that send us forward into active discipleship. Some key questions we took with us are:

Where is God in all of 'this' for you?

<u>Do I recognise God in the ordinary around me?</u>

How can I heighten this awareness in me? In others?

Last week a students asked one of the teachers why we need to clean up when we have a cleaner paid to do it. The teacher responded along the lines of, "When the leper came to Jesus to be cured, did he respond with, 'Why should I bother, since you're only going to hang around with the others." This set the child thinking. As a Catholic, I consciously walk the day with Jesus, my friend, by my side, in my thoughts and in what I do. A question raised on the day is, 'What do people who don't have God in their lives do?"

Out of our day together, staff members are committed to be more proactive in heightening awareness of Jesus in our presence to others around them. This has already begun through our grade Liturgies attended by parents. The challenge has been out there to 'dare' to talk Gospel/God/Jesus beyond the school. One parent reported that she raised the topic during family dinner that night and was going to try to continue. Good for her. Many parents already do this. How many others will take up the challenge and become 'intentional disciples'?

I thank Mrs Byrne, Acting REC for organising and leading this special day for the staff.

GOSPEL REFLECTION

John 6:60-69 Many Disciples Desert Jesus

On hearing it, many of his disciples said, "This is a hard teaching. Who can accept it?" Aware that his disciples were grumbling about this, Jesus said to them, "Does this offend you? Then what if you see the Son of Man ascend to

where he was before! The Spirit gives life; the flesh counts for nothing. The words I have spoken to you—they are full of the Spirit and life. Yet there are some of you who do not believe." For Jesus had known from the beginning which of them did not believe and who would betray him. He went on to say, "This is why I told you that no one can come to me unless the Father has enabled them." From this time many of his disciples turned back and no longer followed him. "You do not want to leave too, do you?" Jesus asked the Twelve. Simon Peter answered him, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and to know that you are the Holy One of God."

In Sunday's Gospel, the crowd who have been listening to Jesus has started to diminish and even Jesus' disciples are struggling with Jesus' teaching. They are unable to accept Jesus' words. There are whispers amongst the crowd and His disciples. Jesus responds by recognising their lack of faith and by reiterating that only those chosen by the Father will follow Jesus to the end. It is at this stage that many leave with only twelve remaining behind. Jesus then wonders if those closest to Him will also leave. It is Peter declares on behalf of the Twelve, that they believe in all Jesus has taught them. They believe that Jesus is the one from God in whom they have found the path to eternal life.

In Sunday's Gospel, there is a focus on the personal faith in the life of Christian discipleship. As Christians, we must make our own judgment about who Jesus is to develop our own personal relationship with God. God's grace invites us to be Jesus' disciples, but each person must respond to the grace of God and confess as his or her own the belief that Jesus is the one from God.

Saint Monica Feast Day August 27



St. Monica was married by arrangement to a pagan official in North Africa, who was much older than she, and although generous, was also violent tempered. His mother Lived with them and was equally difficult, which proved a constant challenge to St. Monica. She had three children; Augustine, Navigius, and Perpetua. Through her patience and prayers, she was able to convert her husband and his mother to the Catholic faith in 370. He died a year later. Perpetua and Navigius entered the religious Life. St. Augustine was much more difficult, as she had to pray for him for 17 years, begging the prayers of priests who, for a while, tried to avoid her because of her persistence at this seemingly hopeless endeavour. One priest did console her by saying, "it is not possible that the son of so many tears should perish." This thought, coupled with a vision that she had received strengthened her. St. Augustine was baptized by St. Ambrose in 387. St. Monica died later that same year, on the way back to Africa from Rome in the Italian town of Ostia. http://www.catholic.org/

SCHOOL UNIFORM


