### **GOSEL REFLECTION**

#### Gospel, John 18:33-37

<sup>3</sup>So Pilate went back into the Praetorium and called Jesus to him and asked him, 'Are you the king of the Jews?' Jesus replied, 'Do you ask this of your own accord, or have others said it to you about me?' Pilate answered, 'Am I a Jew? It is your own people and the chief priests who have handed you over to me: what have you done?' Jesus replied, 'Mine is not a kingdom of this world; if my kingdom were of this world, my men would have fought to prevent my being surrendered to the Jews. As it is, my kingdom does not belong here.' Pilate said, 'So, then you are a



king?' Jesus answered, 'It is you who say that I am a king. I was born for this, I came into the world for this, to bear witness to the truth; and all who are on the side of truth listen to my voice.'

#### Gospel reflection

In Sunday's Gospel, John reflects on the mystery of the Passion and the sacrifice Jesus made for the salvation of humanity. Pilate is questioning Jesus about being the 'king of the Jews.' Jesus explains to Pilate, that kingship is not about power and ruling over a place full of bullying cruelty and dictatorship, but God's kingdom is a blessed place, beyond this world. God's kingdom is attainable by all those who wish to follow Christ. It cannot be reached by exercising power, but through love and humility. Through bearing witness to the truth, Jesus' death and resurrection revealed the Father. We can belong to God's kingdom by bearing witness to him, by being faithful and by helping others to receive salvation from Christ.
