Dear Parents,

When I was a child, I remember being taught about 'plenary indulgences' and how the saying of aspirations (little prayers) could earn days indulgence. They also had different values of earned. My favourite was 'My Lord and my God' which I said every time I genuflected. This was because it earned 296 days indulgence. That means, 296 days fewer that my soul would spend in Purgatory. (CCC 1030 All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven.)



This special Jubilee Year of Mercy offers to all of us the opportunity to be brought into the total state of Grace, perfectly purified. Last Friday, the staff attended a mini pilgrimage with the theme of the Year of Mercy. The day took us across the city through various Mercy Doors. We received the Sacrament of Reconciliation and attended Mass after which we prayed the Hail Mary, Our Father and the Creed. This is the process through which we achieved a state of purification. It is common practice to 'pray for the souls in Purgatory' for their quicker release into Heaven. The repeating of these prayers within the same 24 hour period releases the departed souls of your choice.

Please consider participating in this special opportunity. The nearest Mercy Door is at the Franciscan Shrine, 8 Greyfriar Pl, Kellyville, a beautiful place for prayer and reflection. The Beatitudes is a prayer central to the Year of Mercy. Let us pray...

"Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Blessed are they who mourn, for they shall be comforted.

Blessed are the meek, for they shall inherit the earth.

Blessed are they who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied.

Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called children of God.

Blessed are they who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness,

for theirs is the kingdom of heaven."


Gospel according to Luke 9:18-24

Reflection

Living the Gospel: Jesus' question to the disciples is also addressed to us today. It is a question that every Christian person must answer honestly if they are to grow beyond the simple faith of their childhood. The answers revealed to us may change many times throughout our lives but it is our desire and honest efforts to answer the question itself that will continue to call us forward. Our answer to Jesus' question is an indicator of what we need him to be at that time; who we are at that time; and what we are called to be at that time.

Something to think about:

Why might Jesus have been identified with John the Baptist, Elijah or one of the ancient prophets?

Why might Jesus have commanded the disciples not to tell anyone about their revelation? How has your answer to Jesus' question, 'Who do you say I am?' changed over time? In what ways are you able to reveal to others who you say Jesus is? (Liturgy Help © Greg Sunter 2016)

Literacy News

Vocabulary building tips

- 1. Focus on learning the right kinds of words. Pick words that are more complex or descriptive versions of common words that kids already know. (For example, descriptive adjectives and verbs.) Also, focus on technical words kids need in order to understand a concept or a task that they are currently learning about. Refer to your child's Communication sheet for information on what they are lea rning.
- 2. Learn common roots, prefixes and suffixes to SUPER SIZE vocabulary knowledge. When you learn one word part, you'll begin to easily recognize many more words with the same word parts. http://homeliteracyblueprint.com/building-vocabulary/


Infants Sports Carnival

Cyberwise

This week saw the launch of Cyberwise which is a Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta cybersafety campaign aimed at providing a range of resources, policies, teaching strategies and tips to support young people nationwide in becoming discerning and responsible users of technology and social media. The motto is to 'Be Safe, Be Respectful and Be Responsible'. In each learning space, there is a Cyberwise poster reminding students of these guidelines when using technology. These guidelines maybe used at home with your child/ren when using technology in the home environment.

BE SAFE

- Be aware of how your child uses the internet and explore it with them
- Set rules and monitor to make sure your child knows what information they can share or post online and which websites they can visit
- Teach your child to tell a trusted adult if they feel uncomfortable about something they have found on the internet or received in an email
- Discuss with your child the importance of keeping personal information private. This sort of information can be used to identify or locate where they live, go to school or activities in which they are involved

BE RESPECTFUL

- Talk to your children about cyberbullying. Online communication should be responsible and respectful
- Children and adolescents who are being cyberbullied sometimes change their behaviour. If you are concerned they might be a victim of cyberbullying, talk to them and tell them you are concerned. Arrange to talk to a teacher or school counsellor
- Advise your child not to respond to any negative messages and to keep evidence. Tell them to report any negative messages they receive to you or another trusted
- Children and their parents can contact social media companies and ask for defamatory material to be taken down. If the material is not gone within 48 hours, a complaint can be lodged with the Office of the Children's eSafety Commissioner at www.esafety.gov.au

BE RESPONSIBLE

- Consider using inbuilt filters and controls on your digital devices and home network to manage your children's online access. Keep your virus protection up to date
- Talk with your child about being careful when downloading files or clicking on links. Some files or links may be harmful viruses or trying to obtain personal information
- Certain online activities (downloading illegal videos or music, plaglarism, sexting, identity theft, 'hacking' networks) are illegal and can result in criminal charges


From the Classroom.... Roar! by KB
