- * Most students were able to articulate when talking about their learning.

- * It was noticed about the 'prominent' position of the prayer space in some rooms.
- * Children were confident in explaining their thinking.
- * In some classes, children were using electronic devices effectively to support their learning.
- * Learning spaces were 'vibrant' and rich in print.
- * Word walls/towers were evident.

Gospel Reflection (Mt 10:26-33) Sunday 25th June, 2017

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew *Do not fear those who can kill the body.*

Jesus instructed the Twelve as follows: 'Do not be afraid. For everything that is now covered will be uncovered, and everything now hidden will be made clear. What I say to you in the dark, tell in the daylight; what you hear in whispers, proclaim from the house-tops.

'Do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; fear him rather who can destroy both body and soul in hell. Can you not buy two sparrows for a penny? And yet not one falls to the ground without your Father knowing. Why, every hair on your head has been counted. So there is no need to be afraid; you are worth more than hundreds of sparrows.

'So if anyone declares himself for me in the presence of men, I will declare myself for him in the presence of my Father in heaven. But the one who disowns me in the presence of men, I will disown in the presence of my Father in heaven.'

Living the Gospel

No matter what threat or persecution they are to endure, the command is to proclaim the message of Jesus from the house-tops. Literacy News

Helping Your Child with Spelling:

- Listening skills do help spelling. "What letter does 'chart, end with?" What letter does 'piano' begin with?" Play these games just for a few moments before dinner, or after breakfast to develop your child's ability to hear sounds in words.
- Rhyming words is another game that can build spelling skills. "Can you think of a word that rhymes with fill?" As your child says hill, Bill, till, and so on, write them down. They'll soon notice, themselves, that they have identical endings.
- Remembering. This is a game to develop visual memory. Write one word on a piece of paper. Leave space underneath it. Tell your child to look at it as long as they want, that is, until they can remember the letters, then have them fold the paper so that they cannot see the word. They are then to try to write the word from memory. Let them check it themselves, and if they have misspelled, try again.
- Practice in spelling can come in a variety of ways. For example, you might ask them to help you make a grocery list by looking at the advertisement for a local supermarket You could check the items you want to purchase, and you could ask them to make a list to help you out.

Mid-Year Reports

At this time of the year our teachers are analysing assessment tasks, reporting student growth and progress and preparing to meet with you to discuss your child's learning.

Throughout the year, teachers regularly meet with their teaching partners to reflect, analyse and compare each students work with the syllabus standard. This reflection phase allows teachers the opportunity to evaluate the success of teaching strategies as well as setting a clear direction for future planning for the learning of the students in their class. This phase allows for individual needs to be clearly understood and specific programs to be developed.

At Our Lady Of The Angels, we have developed high expectations for our students' learning. When you receive your child's report, remember to refer to the statements of achievement that describe your child's level of success in each Key Learning Area. Also remember to pay attention to your child's work habits. You might like to keep the following tips in mind when reading your child's report:

Look for strengths first. Focus on the strengths and celebrate these areas. Take into account your child's effort and attitude to learning. If the report indicates that effort needs attention, then this is something on which they need to work on. If your child is putting in the required effort, speak to your child about how pleasing this is and how it has a positive impact on their learning.

Broaden your focus to form a picture of your child's progress as a member of a social setting. How your child gets along with his or her peers will influence their happiness and well-being.

Discuss the report with your son or daughter talking about strengths first before looking at areas that need improvement. Ask for their opinion about how they performed and discuss their concerns.

Students from Years 1 to 6 will receive a level of achievement in each Key Learning Area based on a scale described by the letters A-E. It is important to remember that the majority of students are expected to receive 'C' grades which indicate that they are achieving the expected outcomes.

A considerable amount of time and consideration is put into allocating the grades for each student. Grades are allocated based on a number of variables such as student work samples, assessment tasks, observations and class work.

Please keep in mind that your child's grades may have varied from previous years, especially if they have moved into a new stage this year.

Sometimes the A-E scale is confusing for parents as it is not graded in the same way that reports were constructed when we were at school. To put the A-E reporting system into perspective, it may be helpful to look at the analogy below for driving a car.


