Dear Parents,

I am looking forward to seeing the jacarandas grow and in full bloom either side of these huts. Work on establishing the rest of the oval, once and for all, is another project for the near future.



Other work carried out was replacement of all the Perspex over verandas and covered walkways that were damaged by hail earlier in the year.

Looking at the calendar, there are many exciting events across the term. I thank God for keeping us all safe and well over the holidays and pray for the wisdom to make sound decisions and the energy for all of us to continue the good work for our students.

#### **Opening and Blessing**

Each time a new building is completed, there is an official opening and blessing ceremony. We have now come to the last of the 'construction' part of this journey. In the past, we have included all the students and members of the parent body. However, now that the numbers are so much greater, logistically this is not possible. The parent body will be represented by those who received an invitation. These are the P&F Committee members and the class parent liaison persons who act as your class' contact throughout the year. From the student body will be the school captains and vice captains. I understand there may be some people who will be disappointed. However, thanks to the technology available, this event will be live-streamed throughout the school on a big screen in the learning spaces as well as available to you, via You Tube, the URL for which will be provided closer to the day. 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## Gospel Reflection 15th October 2017 (Mt 22:1-10)

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

#### Whomsoever you find invite to the wedding.

Jesus said to the chief priests and elders of the people: "The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who gave a feast for his son's wedding. He sent his servants to call those who had been invited, but they would not come. Next he sent some more servants. "Tell those who have been invited" he said "that I have my banquet all prepared, my oxen and fattened cattle have been slaughtered, everything is ready. Come to the wedding." But they were not interested: one went off to his farm, another to his business, and the rest seized his servants, maltreated them and killed them. The king was furious. He dispatched his troops, destroyed those murderers and burnt their town. Then he said to his servants, "The wedding is ready; but as those who were invited proved to be unworthy, go to the crossroads in the town and invite everyone you can find to the wedding." So these servants were out onto the roads and collected together everyone they could find, bad and good alike; and the wedding hall was filled with guests.'

### Gospel Reflection

What a story! It's not your typical wedding. The king is God. The first people invited are those who reject God's way of living. The second people are those who don't expect the invitation but are delighted when it comes, and they accept it wholeheartedly. And the person not properly dressed represents those who may say that they have accepted God's invitation, but whose life choices show that they have not yet really said yes to God. When have you been among the first group – those who don't care about church, who don't want to be involved with anything 'churchy', and who don't think faith is relevant today? What do you think Jesus would say to you about this attitude? When have you been among the second group – those who see that faith is important, who try to live their faith by doing works of service, and who aren't embarrassed by their relationship with God? What do you think Jesus would say to you about this attitude? When have you been among the third group – those who say that faith is important and yet don't really practise their faith. What do you think Jesus would say to you about this attitude?

## Ways to Build Children's Vocabulary ENGAGE CHILDREN IN RICH ORAL LANGUAGE

Children learn words through talk, especially from listening to and participating in high-level conversations. For example, one study showed that young children whose parents use more "rare words" at the dinner table had higher vocabularies and later reading achievement than other children. In school we need to involve children in rich, meaningful conversations whenever we can.

### 2018 Parramatta Diocesan Team Sport Trials

Currently only the Summer Sports of BASKETBALL & TENNIS are open and registrations close on Friday 27<sup>th</sup> October as these trials will be held in November 2017.
All other sport registrations will open in November for 2018 trials.

Any Primary students enrolled in Year 5 and 6 in 2018 are invited to participate in the Parramatta Diocesan Team Sport Trials during Term Four in 2017 and Term One in 2018. In some sports students in Year 4 **MAY** nominate.

It is important to note that these trials are generally for those children who display an above average ability and/or have representative experience in their chosen sport. While teams are open in age it is strongly recommended that only children of a representative standard in Years 5 & 6 in 2018 be invited to attend.

Parramatta Diocesan trials will be held in the following sports:

\*AFL (boys), Basketball (B&G), Cricket (B&G), Diving (B&G), Hockey (B&G), Football (B&G), Golf (B&G), Hockey (B&G), Netball (girls), Rugby League (11yrs & Opens), Rugby Union (boys), Softball (B&G), Tennis (B&G), & Touch(B&G).

To be eligible for selection for these trials an Online Team Registration Form must be completed that can be accessed via the website www.primarysportparra.catholic.edu.au

This online form is an **EXPRESSION OF INTEREST** for the 2018 Parramatta Diocesan Primary Sport Team trials. Parents may complete this form to attend a selection trial. One form is to be completed per child, per individual sport. Each sport has its own criteria therefore, it is imperative that the correct form is completed.

Please note that your online registration is an **EXPRESSION OF INTEREST ONLY** and **MUST be approved by the child's school**. In order for the child to attend the nominated trial or event this may come down to the discretion of the school as to who is selected to attend the trial. In some sports only 2 students per school can be nominated. **All fields and especially** "**Representative Experience**" **MUST be completed**.

Under no circumstances will a child be eligible to trial if the Online Registration Form has not been completed and approved by the school by the closing date.

#### PBS4L

Our PBS4L focus continues this term. Our focus for the next two weeks is *Safe and fair play*. Our students are encouraged to show respect for themselves and others by playing safely. When someone is hurt they should show care and apologise if necessary. This can also be reinforced at home - if someone is hurt,



check if they are ok and apologise if needed. Shoppers apologise when bumping trolleys in the supermarket; tradesmen apologise when something goes wrong. There are many instances in the community where we make mistakes and need to apologise.

Each term, we acknowledge a class which acquires the highest number of angel cards per student. The winning class for term 3 was 6G. In a few weeks they will have a water fun session as their reward. Congratulations 6G!!!


