GOSPEL REFLECTION-SUNDAY 9TH DECEMBER SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT-YEAR C LK 3:1-6

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke *All people shall see the salvation of God.*

In the fifteenth year of Tiberius Caesar's reign, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judaea, Herod tetrarch of Galilee, his brother Philip tetrarch of the lands of Ituraea and Trachonitis, Lysanias tetrarch of Abilene, during the pontificate of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah, in the wilderness. He went through the whole Jordan district proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the sayings of the prophet Isaiah:

A voice cries in the wilderness; Prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight. Every valley will be filled in, every mountain and hill be laid low, winding ways will be straightened and rough roads made smooth. And all mankind shall see the salvation of God.

Reflection

Do we have to be like John the Baptist, eccentrically dressed and scavenging for food, to prepare the way of the Lord? No. You and I are called to be a John or Joan the Baptist, preparing people's hearts in our own time and place.

But we have to allow God to prepare our hearts for this role. John the Baptist challenges us to 'Repent', i.e. to turn around our own lives seeking God's forgiveness. John then challenges us to see the big picture which is that 'All who live shall see the salvation of God'.

Pope Francis is the exemplary universal pastor inspiring us to become 'les mercifuls sans frontieres'. And young people through social media are already saying 'We are one community of human beings on this fragile planet'.

The challenge for most of us is more immediate and apparently of smaller scope. The challenge this Advent is to identify the one person whose heart you can help prepare to celebrate the coming of the Lord Jesus in three weeks' time. The best method is to let that person see your faith and joy centred on that little Jewish baby lying in a manger.

Do that, and who knows what may happen because that little baby is in fact the Sovereign Lord of history and of the whole cosmos. With God's grace, you don't have to be as eccentric or bizarre as John the Baptist to play your part in changing the course of history!

We could take a moment to pray that, repenting of our own sins where necessary, we may prepare the heart of at least one person so that the Lord Jesus may enter in this Christmas, helping him fulfil his mission that all who live shall see the salvation of God.

Swimming Carnival - Years 2 - 5

This is a reminder that the school swimming carnival will be held next Wednesday 12th December.

Venue: Hawkesbury Oasis Pool, Cnr Church & Drummond Streets, South Windsor.
Time: Carnival will commence at 9.30am and finish at approximately 1.30pm.
Transport: <u>All students will be transported to and from the pool by bus</u>. Please be at school by 8.40am.
Bring: Towel, hat, sunscreen, recess, lunch, water, goggles.

Wear: Swimmers underneath your sport uniform.

Students competing in the 100m Freestyle events will need to be dropped at the pool and marshalling will be at 8.45am for 9am event starting times.

Acceptable Hair Styles for Boys.

There are some secondary schools that employ a hairdresser on the first day of the school year to 'correct' the hair styles of some boys' who the school deems as inappropriate. We would not consider any such action as we believe we have a relationship of mutual respect and a parent body that, on the whole, observes the rules of the school. This is a condition of the enrolment process. The following is a passage in the parent handbook that refers to this...

"Hair is to be neat and tidy, off the collar, of consistent natural colour, of gradual even grade and extremes of fashion are to be avoided. Some examples of the styles that are unacceptable include: ridges, undercuts, steps, any excessive shaping with products, and any shaving cuts."

Sadly, much of this has been ignored among some parents. This includes boys' long hair in pony tails. Please take this into consideration in the count down to the start of the new school year in 2019.

From the Classroom of 6B

Year 6 Earth Changing Experience

This term, Year 6 have been learning about Earth and Space, focusing on the Earth's place in the solar system, changes on its surface that are caused by natural disasters. Early in the term we went to the Sydney Observatory to learn about our Solar System and how the sun and the moon affect the seasons. We also learnt about how the Aborigines use astronomy to help with different aspects of their culture. We concluded our unit by creating earth changing experiences, that affect the earth's surface. Here are some of our experiments-

Tsunami-a long, high sea wave caused by an earthquake or other disturbance. (Mikayla/Klaudia)



Cyclone-a system of winds rotating inwards to an area of low barometric pressure, with an anticlockwise (northern hemisphere) or clockwise (southern hemisphere) circulation (Charlotte/Alisa/Jane)





Earthquake-a sudden violent shaking of the ground, typically causing great destruction, as a result of movements within the

earth's crust or volcanic action. (Jasmyn/Ella)

Volcano- mountain or hill, typically conical, having a crater or vent through which lava, rock fragments, hot vapour, and gas are or have been erupted from the earth's crust. (Matthew, Olivia, Harry and David)
