
Dear Parents,

Grandparents' Day

God speaks to us in many ways, including through the Sunday Scripture readings. We hear The Word, and are given messages to help us show the face of God.

Sunday 4th August: Parable of the rich man with a good harvest. (Lk 12:13-21)

One of the themes running through the gospels is that wealth can be an obstacle to entering fully into relationship with God. Wealth is not problematic but rather the value we put on material riches above all else. We have the story of the rich young man who asks Jesus what he must do to inherit the kingdom and Jesus tells him to sell everything he has and give away the proceeds. The young man goes away sad because he thought that with his great accumulation of wealth he'd be able to buy anything that he needed to gain the kingdom. Money can make life a little easier to manage at times, but a famous proverb proclaims that 'money can't buy happiness'.

Sunday, 11th August: Nineteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time-Year C (Lk 12:32-48)

Sunday's Gospel calls us to be ready and watchful, 'for the Son of Man is coming at an unexpected hour'. While we live in the expectation of the coming of God in the future, we also live now in the presence of God. This means that God is present with us now, as a companion in our lives. It also means that this presence is the context within which our lives unfold. However, until all things are brought to fulfilment, we live in this presence by faith. Faith and hope are intimately joined. We, as believers, are called to keep the faith and trust in the promises of God. Faith is both the cost of living as a disciple and the reward.

Today we celebrated Our Lady of the Angels Feast Day with a whole school mass. It was a wonderful chance to celebrate our Blessed Lady of Angels, Mary and to mark our 10th Anniversary.

Sarah Davis Visit- Wednesday 14th August (Infants classes)



Sarah is an award-winning illustrator who has collaborated with a number of leading authors in Australia, New Zealand and America. Sarah has illustrated 37 books, and has been shortlisted for 30 major awards in both Australia and New Zealand.

Sarah won the 2009 Children's Book Council of Australia's Crichton Award for Best New Illustrator, and has illustrated the multiple picture book series *Fearless*, written by Colin Thompson, the first of which was short-listed for the 2010 Children's Book Council of Australia Awards. Sarah has number also illustrated the Violet Mackerel series with author Anna Branford, shortlisted for the CBCA Book of the Year Awards in 2011, and won CBCA Honour Book in 2011.


Monty Pryor Visit- Monday 19th August (Primary classes)



Monty is a multi-talented performer who has worked in numerous industries including film, television, modelling, sport, music and theatre-in-education. He is also known as an articulate public speaker on Aboriginal issues.

Monty Pryor was born in 1950 in Townsville, North Queensland. His father was from the Birrigubba of the Bowen region and his mother is from Yarrabah (near Cairns), a descendant of the KUNGGANJI. Monty played Basketball for the Queensland under 18's while studying at Pimlico State High and then went on to play Victorian State championship league for five years. He was the coach for the first National Aboriginal Women's Basketball team. Monty is an accomplished didjeridoo player who has performed solo with the Brisbane Symphony Orchestra. Since the early nineties Monty has performed internationally at Museums, Theatres and Festivals.

Monty has collaborated with Meme McDonald on five books: Maybe Tomorrow (Penguin 1998), My Girragundji (Allen & Unwin 1998), The Binna Binna Man (Allen & Unwin 1999), Nunjul The Sun (Allen and Unwin 2002) and Flytrap (Allen & Unwin 2002). Maybe Tomorrow received a Special Commendation at the 1998 Human Rights Awards and My Girragundji was awarded The Children's Book Council of Australia 1999 Book of The Year Award.


Students' Artwork at the Fiesta

Afternoon Dismissal Procedure

In the afternoon our students are taken to two locations for dismissal.

Kinder students are collected from the Kinder COLA between 3pm and 3.10pm.

- Students who are collected through 'Kiss and ride' are taken to the Kinder COLA and library verandah.
- All students in years 1 6, who are collected by parents on site or who walk or catch the bus home, are taken to the 'Undercover' basketball court.

It would assist us if parents wait in the relevant area for your child. We are trying to minimise congestion around classrooms.

Only kinder parents should drive into the 'drive through' prior to 3pm. If you are collecting students in years 1 to 6, it might be more convenient to queue up down Wellgate Ave alongside the netball courts. This way you can turn left into the school grounds after 3.05pm.

We have had issues with trades people and parish visitors being unable to enter the grounds as the driveway is blocked with cars queuing for pick up. If you are entering to park your car, you are then able to do so.
