Dear Parents.

Welcome back to school for Term 2. I hope you had a lovely two week break from school with your children and that it was an opportunity to celebrate the joys of Easter with family and friends. On our return to school, the Year 6 students led the community in an Alleluia Liturgy – Alleluia for Jesus has risen to life. Through His suffering and death, He has brought us the possibility and hope of salvation and everlasting life.

This week we find ourselves in the month of May, traditionally the month devoted to Our Lady. This has significance for us as a Marian school, Our Lady of the Angels being our patron. We remember to pray to God, through Mary our heavenly mother.





Of course Mothers' Day is also part of May celebrations. The P&F are holding a Mothers' Day stall next Wednesday. On Friday, Kindergarten will be leading the Mothers' Day liturgy at 8.50am. This will be followed by morning tea and then open classrooms from 9.30am to just after 10am. Due to the increase in numbers, we ask that this is for mothers only, where possible. This month is one of particular significance in Parramatta Diocese. There is a focus of fundraising for the Diocesan Works Fund and the school will be involved in supporting this drive as part of its Social Justice Program. There is full information on this further in this newsletter.

As you would know, St Francis is also our patron of our school. For this reason, last year's Year 6 class donated a statue of St Francis for our grounds. This has now been erected in our garden on a stone base donated by the Topic family (Nicola and Ante pictured left). Thank you, once again, to the families in our community for their generosity.

First Communion

Over the next four Sundays, many students from OLA, mostly Year 3, will be receiving the blessed Eucharist for the first time. Please remember to keep these children in your prayers as they enter into this very special relationship with God. It is not reasonable to expect all teachers to attend each First Communion Mass but I am pleased to say that there will be a number of staff attending each Mass to show school support for the students partaking in this special event.



At OLA, the Sacramental Programs are parish based. Any enquiries and directions come from the parish. There have been some enquiries about attending Reconciliation before First Communion. It is the responsibility of the parents to ensure that their child has had this opportunity before the day. Reconciliation is available in OLA church every Saturday at 9am.

Gospel Reflection Third Sunday of Easter, Cycle A

A reading from the Gospel of Luke 24:13-35

"That very day, the first day of the week, two of Jesus' disciples were going to a village seven miles from Jerusalem called Emmaus, and they were conversing about all the things that had occurred.

And it happened that while they were conversing and debating, Jesus himself drew near and walked with them, but their eyes were prevented from recognizing him. He asked them, "What

are you discussing as you walk along?"

They stopped, looking downcast. One of them, named Cleopas, said to him in reply,

"Are you the only visitor to Jerusalem who does not know of the things that have taken place there in these days?" And he replied to them, "What sort of things?"

They said to him, "The things that happened to Jesus the Nazarene, who was a prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people, how our chief priests and rulers both handed him over to a sentence of death and crucified him. But we were hoping that he would be the one to redeem Israel; and besides all this, it is now the third day since this took place. Some women from our group, however, have astounded us: they were at the tomb early in the morning and did not find his body; they came back and reported that they had indeed seen a vision of angels who announced that he was alive.

Then some of those with us went to the tomb and found things just as the women had described, but him they did not see."

And he said to them, "Oh, how foolish you are! How slow of heart to believe all that the prophets spoke! Was it not necessary that the Christ should suffer these things and enter into his glory?"

Then beginning with Moses and all the prophets, he interpreted to them what referred to him in all the Scriptures. As they approached the village to which they were going, he gave the impression that he was going on farther. But they urged him, "Stay with us, for it is nearly evening and the day is almost over." So he went in to stay with them. And it happened that, while he was with them at table, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them. With that their eyes were opened and they recognized him,

but he vanished from their sight. Then they said to each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he spoke to us on the way and opened the Scriptures to us?"

So they set out at once and returned to Jerusalem where they found gathered together the eleven and those with them who were saying, "The Lord has truly been raised and has appeared to Simon!"

Then the two recounted what had taken place on the way and how he was made known to them in the breaking of bread."

When we read today's Gospel, we may be surprised to learn that these friends of Jesus could walk and converse with him at some length yet not recognize him. Again we discover that the risen Jesus is not always easily recognized. Cleopas and the other disciple walk with a person whom they believe to be a stranger; only later do they discover that the stranger is Jesus. We learn that the first community met and recognized Jesus in the breaking of the bread, just as we meet Jesus in the Eucharist.

We can imagine the feelings of the two disciples in today's reading. They are leaving their community in Jerusalem. Their friend Jesus has been crucified. Their hope is gone. They are trying to make sense of what has occurred, so that they can put the experience behind them.

Jesus himself approaches the two men, but they take him for a stranger. Jesus asks them what they are discussing. He invites them to share their experience and interpretation of the events surrounding his crucifixion and death. When the two disciples have done so, Jesus offers his own interpretation of his crucifixion and resurrection, citing Jewish Scripture. In that encounter we find the model for our Liturgy of the Word—what we do each time we gather as a community for the Eucharist. We reflect upon our life experiences and interpret them in light of Scripture. We gather together to break open the Word of God.

Christ appears in children's lives in various forms. Like the two disciples on the road to Emmaus, however, young children may not yet recognize Jesus' presence in their lives. As teachers and parents we can help children to recognize Jesus in the Scriptures, the Eucharist, and the people around them, and we can invite them into a deeper relationship with Jesus.

Could all families please return their project compassion boxes to school as soon as possible so that the money can be collected and sent to Caritas. Thank you for your generosity.

Japanese Students.

As part of the Asian Studies Program, OLA has been fortunate to secure a grant to support the teaching of Japanese language and culture since the beginning. Last year this program was supported and enriched with the hosting of Japanese students. These students, aged 10-12 years old, were billeted by OLA families and spent the days at school. This was so successful last year

that the school has again requested to visit and there are many more students excited to spend time at OLA, and an Australian school. There are 31 children in total with 23 girls and 8 boys to be hosted in twos with one group of three girls. The details are:

Dates: 23 July (Wed) until 29 July (Tue) for 6 nights

Host families will be paid \$40 per night per child and will provide 3 meals a day and return transfer to/from school.

The guests will spend the day in class with their host 'brother/sister'. The weekend is spent with the host family. However, on the Sunday, the guests are to be dropped at OLA school where they will travel with their group to their church in Marsfield. They will need to be collected at 4pm from OLA school.

These students are from Nanzan Christian School located in Nagoya, Japan. They are very well behaved students from good families.
