Last term, it was a privilege to be part of the celebration of First Communion for most of our Year 3 students. They were very excited and truly glowing from having received Christ within themselves. As children, they are reliant on the adults in their lives to ensure that they have this opportunity.



## Gospel Reflection

### Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year A

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew 13:24-30

*Jesus put a parable before the crowds, 'The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a man who sowed good seed in his field. While everybody was asleep his enemy came, sowed darnel all among the wheat, and made off. When the new wheat sprouted and ripened, the darnel appeared as well. The owner's servants went to him and said, "Sir, was it not good seed that you sowed in your field?*

*If so, where does the darnel come from?" "Some enemy has done this" he answered. And the servants said, "Do you want us to go and weed it out?" But he said, "No, because when you weed out the darnel you might pull up the wheat with it. Let them both grow till the harvest; and at harvest time I shall say to the reapers: First collect the darnel and tie it in bundles to be burnt, then gather the wheat into my barn." "Today is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. This day was once called Corpus Christi, which is Latin for "Body of Christ."*

The parable found in today's Gospel reminds us as Christian people about the Kingdom of God and encourages us in our daily life. As the wheat and weeds must grow together until the harvest, so we may not know whether our actions contribute to God's Kingdom until God's final judgement. This helps us to remember we must always act in a prayerful way that will be consistent with God's plans. We ask God to work through us for the sake of the Kingdom of Heaven.

Share a meal with your family this week. Jesus teaches us in the Gospel that God can work wonders from even the smallest things. The littlest of things we do can make a big difference in the lives of others. What can we do as a family to make things better for others? Pray that God will use your family to make a difference in the world.


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## Saint of the week: St. Benedict

**Feast Day: July 11**

**Born: 480 :: Died: 547**

St. Benedict was born in Italy. Coming from a rich Italian family, his life was full of adventure and wonderful events. As a boy, he was sent to Rome to study in the public schools but was troubled by the bad behavior of the other students. When he was a young man, he became disgusted with the terrible lifestyle of pagan Rome (Romans who believed in false gods). Benedict left the city and went looking for a place where he could be alone with God. He found the right spot. It was a cave in the mountain of Subiaco. Benedict spent three years there alone. The devil often tempted him to go back to his rich home and easy life. But Benedict prayed and did penance and did not give in to these temptations.



Benedict became the leader of many good monks. He started twelve monasteries. Then he went to Monte Cassino where he built his most well-known monastery. It was here that St. Benedict wrote the wonderful rules for the Benedictine order. He taught his monks to pray and work hard. He taught them especially to be humble always. Benedict and his monks greatly helped the people of their times. They taught them how to read and write, how to farm, and how to work at different trades. St. Benedict was able to do good because he prayed all the time.

**School Fees**:- The term 3 school fees were sent out in the holidays. If you are on the flexible payment plan then you would not have received an account.

*Please note:* The swim program (K-4) of \$100 and CPR program (Yr 5/6) of \$10 have been billed on the term 3 account. This amount has not been included in the flexible payment plan or the salary sacrifice plan, and so a separate payment will need to be made directly to the office. Please attend to this at the end of your plan.
