Dear Parents,

Peer Review

All schools are subject to an educational audit to ensure they are compliant with the Board of Studies requirements. As a new school, OLA was subjected to one of these each year as it grew until we had completed the Kinder to Year 6 range. Our system has introduced a process called Peer review where a school is given a week's notice of Stage and two KLAs to produce all the required documentation as proof of compliance. This is then scrutinised by a panel consisted of peers from other schools, the CEDP Compliance Officer and the Director of school performance.

I am very happy to report that the Stage 3 team – Mrs Byrne, Mrs Giglio and Ms Pepin- came through brilliantly. Many extra hours of work went into preparing for the day and it is greatly appreciated. Well done ladies.

CENTENARY OF ANZAC

'At 0500hrs, three platoons of the leading company of the 7th Battalion set off in four of the ship's boats. As they moved away from the dim light, the Company Commander, Major Jackson could see the flashes of shells and rifles to their front. Approaching the shore, the men caught the sound of firing; to their right they could see shells bursting over other boats of the Battalion. Ahead they saw rifle and machine gun fire cutting up the water. As the lead boat, under the command of Captain Layh, entered the field of fire, five out of the six rowers were shot, but others took the oars, and they pushed on. The boat was scraping the shingle when, as Captain Layh threw himself into the water beside it, he was shot through the hip. As he turned to call the men forward, he was again shot in the leg. With the survivors, he scrambled toward the little grass-tufted sand hummocks fringing the beach, and they lay low behind them. Of the 140 men in the four boats, only 3 officers and 36 men, many wounded, made the safety of the hummocks, the rest lay dead or dying behind them.' (C.E.W. Bean, 'The Story of ANZAC'

- 8 The cross is to remind us of all the soldiers and civilians who like Jesus gave their lives unselfishly for others.
- 8 An Australian flag is draped over the cross to remind us that this is truly a national day of prayer for peace, when we pray for all those who died or were injured in war.
- 8 We place red poppies at the foot of the cross to remind us of the great sacrifice of those who lost their lives and the need to turn from war and hatred to become peace-seeking people.
- ⊗ Rosemary is used as a symbol of remembrance because it has a smell that is unforgettable.
- Our school's Centenary of Anzac perpetual remembrance plaque commemorates 100 years since the lading of the ANZACs in Gallipoli.
- Our Lady Help of Christians and St Mary of the Cross MacKillop, the Patron Saints of



Lord, we give you thanks for the freedoms we enjoy in this land and for those who laid down their lives to defend them. We pray that we and all the people of Australia, gratefully remembering their courage and their sacrifice, may have grace to live in a spirit of justice, of generosity and of peace. We ask this through Christ, our Lord, Amen.
