Dear Parents,

Last week, Pope Francis appointed the Most Rev Vincent Long Van Nguyen as the fourth Bishop of Parramatta. He has been the Auxiliary Bishop of the Archdiocese of Melbourne since 2011. Bishop Long succeeds Anthony Fisher OP. The new Bishop of Parramatta was born in Vietnam in 1961. His family came to Australia as refugees in 1980. After his ordination in 1989, Bishop long went to Rome to further his studies.

Bishop Long was Parish priest at Our Lady of the Rosary, Kellyville from 1998-2002 and so is no stranger to the area.

We welcome Bishop Vincent Long to the Diocese of Parramatta and pray for him as he begins his work in our diocese.

Gospel according to John (Jn17: 20-26)

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you."

When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again,

"Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you."

And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them,

"Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."



Pentecost

*The season of Easter concludes with the feast of **Pentecost**. On **Pentecost** we celebrate the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles gathered in the upper room in Jerusalem; this event marks the beginning of the Church. The account in the Gospel, taken from the Gospel of John, also recounts how Jesus gave the gift of the Holy Spirit to his disciples. There is no need to try to reconcile these two accounts to each other. It is enough to know that, after his death, Jesus fulfilled his promise to send to his disciples a helper, an advocate, who would enable them to be his witnesses throughout the world.*

***Pentecost is sometimes called the birthday of the Church.** The Gospel for **Pentecost** reminds us that the Church begins with the command to forgive. Within the family, the domestic Church, we learn how to forgive and we learn to accept forgiveness. It is the gift of the Holy Spirit that enables us to do both. Today is a fitting time to share a family celebration of reconciliation.*

As you gather together as a family, sit quietly for a few minutes, inviting all to reflect upon their need to forgive and to receive forgiveness. If there is a situation or issue within the family that needs attention, spend some time reflecting upon the concern and how your family might address it. Talk together about how Jesus gave us the gift of the Holy Spirit to help us in the work of forgiveness and to bring us peace.




