

Dear Parents,

On Sunday night, I found myself in a frame of mind similar to that of most people on the eve of returning to work after some time off. However, with Monday morning came the realisation of just how delightful it was for me to be among my OLA 'family' once again. I would like to acknowledge the good work of Mrs Hey and other members of the leadership team in my absence.



In Week 10's Newsletter, I noted to watch this space for more on the Mysterion, God's saving plan. After the Resurrection, Jesus appeared at various times for over forty days until His Ascension into Heaven. Before He left, He promised His disciples that He would send 'a helper' to continue His work on earth. Sunday was Pentecost Sunday, the day the Holy Spirit – the 'helper' – came among Mary and the disciples allowing them to continue the work to spread the Word, building a world of justice and love, often referred to as the Kingdom or Reign of God. God's Kingdom is present today and continues because those baptised over the past 2000 years carried on Jesus' work. Through Baptism, it is presently our responsibility to continue building God's Kingdom and, in the process, earn our place in Heaven, made possible through Jesus' death and resurrection. This is at the core of the purpose of our existence. We have an opportunity to do this each moment of every day, with each person we encounter. I know I don't always do it as well as I should. Does anyone?

Feast of the Most Holy Trinity Gospel, John 16:12-15

Jesus said to His disciples: 'I still have many things to say to you but they would be too much for you to bear now. However, when the Spirit of truth comes he will lead you to complete truth, since he will not be speaking of his own accord, but will say only what he has been told; and he will reveal to you the things to come. He will glorify me, since all he reveals to you will be taken from what is mine. Everything the Father has is mine; that is why I said; all he reveals to you will be taken from what is mine.'



Reflection

In last Sunday's Gospel, we celebrated Pentecost. Jesus is departing from us out of sight, but he continues to assure us of His presence through His gift of the Holy Spirit. It is through the Spirit that God's unconditional love brings about unity. This Sunday we celebrate the unity of the Father, Son and Spirit in Trinity Sunday. Jesus tells His disciples that the Father and the Son will send the Spirit to continue with their expression of love. When the disciples face uncertainty about the future, the Holy Trinity's presence will always be with them. They will never be alone. The intimate connection between Jesus and the Father as well as Jesus and the Spirit, is revealed in the Trinity. The Holy Spirit sent to the disciples continues the mission of Jesus. We also need to continue Jesus' mission, with God's unconditional love and guidance from the gift of the Holy Spirit that we receive through the sacraments.




May is the month of Mary




