Dear Parents.

This Sunday is Pentecost Sunday, the day that is recognised as the birthday of the Church on earth. Before He ascended into Heaven, Jesus promised the disciples that He would send a helper to continue God's work, to bring about the Kingdom of Heaven, the reign of God, a world of justice and love. This helper, the Holy Spirit, came upon the disciples and Mary and gave them the gifts -knowledge, wisdom, strength, wonder, right judgement, courage and understanding – that enabled them to go out into the world and proclaim the good news. This good news (Gospel) is that our God is a loving and merciful God and that each of us, through Baptism, are invited into eternal life with Him.

God so loves us that His saving plan began immediately after the Fall of Adam and Eve. He asked Abraham to prepare the people for the Saviour. God sent His Son to be born human and die for us to bring the message of salvation to all. This message has continued to be passed on by the people of the church for 2000 years. Today, it is we, members of the Catholic Church that, through our Baptism, are called to continue to bring this message to others in the things we do and say. At the end of each Mass, we are asked to 'go forth and spread the news' and continue Jesus' message and build a world of justice and love. The Old Testament taught us to love our neighbour. Jesus, in the New Testament, teaches us to love our enemy – quite a challenge.

Saint of the Week: Saint Phillip Neri Feast Day May 26th



As a child Phillip was called "Good little Phil" because he was always happy and friendly to everyone – everybody loved Phillip. When he got older he went to study in Rome with the Dominican priests. He was a good student and a very good Christian. He did everything he could to bring people closer to Jesus. When he turned 36 years old he felt like God was calling him to become a priest. As a priest Fr. Phillip really helped everyone around him. He would listen to confessions for hours a day and no matter how many people lined up to come and receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation, he was always patient, kind and gentle with everyone. At one point he thought maybe he should go to a far off land to be a missionary; but a wise monk told him that Rome was his mission field and he really did so much to bring the people of Rome closer to

God. A few years before he died he started working with young people, finding them safe places to play and becoming their friend, so that he could lead them to God.

Gospel Reflection John 20: 19-23



On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst

and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them,

"Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."

Pentecost is sometimes called the birthday of the Church. The Gospel for Pentecost reminds us that the Church begins with the command to forgive. Within the family, the domestic church, we learn how to forgive and how to accept forgiveness. The gift of the Holy Spirit enables us to do both. Today is a fitting time to share a family celebration of reconciliation. As you gather together as a family, sit quietly for a few minutes, inviting everyone to reflect upon their need to forgive and to receive forgiveness. If there is a situation or issue within the family that needs attention, spend some time reflecting on how your family might address it. Talk together about how Jesus gave us the gift of the Holy Spirit to help us in the work of forgiveness and to bring us peace. Pray together today's psalm or the Prayer to the Holy Spirit, asking that the Holy Spirit help your family. Share with one another the Sign of Peace.

FROM THE CLASSROOM... Year KB



Literacy Hint -

Beginning readers need to know that what they are doing is right so they can keep doing it. We can tell them with simple, specific praises. When your child is pointing to each word as he reads say. "I like how you're pointing to the words. That's just what good readers do." When your child looks at the pictures to help figure out what a new word is say, "I like how you're looking at the pictures to help figure out that new word." When your child stops at a new word because it's too hard say, "I like how you stopped at that tough word. That says (tell them the word)." When your child starts to sound out new words say, "I like how you're looking at the letters in that word." When your child sees an exclamation mark and makes his voice louder, say, "I like how you made your voice louder when you saw that exclamation mark." Do the same thing for question marks. By using specific praise, you're helping your child develop good reading habits. This will help him become a stronger reader.
