Dear Parents,

This Sunday is the Feast of the Ascension. After His resurrection, Jesus stayed on Earth for forty days to prepare His disciples for their work to come. Jesus told them that He would return to His Father in heaven but not to worry as He promised that he would send a helper.

After witnessing Jesus death, the disciples were scared and worried about what the authorities might do to them, being followers of Jesus. Soon after the Ascension, the disciples and Mary were together in a room when something amazing happened...



"When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. ²And suddenly a sound came from heaven like the rush of a mighty wind, and it filled all the house where they were sitting. ³And there appeared to them tongues as of fire, distributed and resting on each one of them. ⁴And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance." Acts 2: 1-4



The helper had come as promised – the Holy Spirit. The Spirit provided the gifts of knowledge, wisdom, courage, right judgement, wonder, understanding and reverence. Jesus came on earth to begin His mission of building a world of justice and love. These gifts of the Holy Spirit are what allowed the disciples to continue the work of Jesus, their Master. From Jerusalem to Asia Minor and across the then known world, largely the Roman Empire, Christianity grew and spread. In many cases at the cost of lives given in the name of Jesus as Christians practised their faith and celebrated the Eucharist in secret. Over two thousand years later, this mission is also our mission. It became ours in Baptism and was 'confirmed' at receiving the Holy Spirit in Sacrament of Confirmation. It is renewed each week when we partake in the Eucharist at Mass on Sundays.

Data from last year shows that, in the UK, people of no faith outnumbered Christians. Our Catholic faith gives us the promise of hope for everlasting life. People of no faith are at risk of having no hope and purpose in their lives. I want my children and grandchildren to live in a Christian world that promotes Justice and Love. I hope you do, too. For this reason, we need to be 'actively Christian', open to proclaiming and acting out our Christian values. The Holy Spirit provides us with the tools to do this if we are aware, pray for it and receive it.

Gospel Reflection







Helping Your Child with Spelling:

If your child is working on a class spelling list and can only remember half of the words, speak to their teacher. Don't tackle an entire spelling bar in one sitting. Take one-third for example, each evening, to work on with your child. Break the practice into small units. Try fifteen minutes of review when they get home; fifteen minutes before dinner; fifteen minutes after dinner. Shorter periods given frequently are more effective than one massive review-which is also exhausting and frustrating.

To host a student, your own children can be of any age. Also, KTOOSH have confirmed that they will accommodate any of their families billeting Japanese students.

This has been a regular practice over the past years. OLA School acts as host to students from Nanzan Christian School in Japan. The students have always proven to be very polite and grateful and it has been a wonderful experience for the host family as well as their guests.

The following is the program:

26th July 2017 (Wed): Arr. OLA Primary School and meet host families (15:20)

27th (Thurs): Integrated program (at school)

28th (Fri): Integrated program (at school)

29th (Sat): Free with host families

30th (Sun): Group visiting SVD church in Marsfield (11:00-13:00- dropped at OLA grounds at 10.30am)

31st (Mon): Integrated program (at school)

1st Aug (Tue): Integrated program (at school), farewell depart (from school) at 13:00 approx

It is preferred that these children are billeted in twos and have their own room. The **host family will receive \$40 x 6 nights = \$240 (per students) X 2 students = \$480 per family**




Notes will go out soon but we will only be able to form teams if we get umpires. At this stage, we only have 3 umpires.

REMINDER.... Official school hours for supervision start at 8.20am and finish at 3.40pm. Leaving children before this time means they are unsupervised. Many children are being dropped as early as 8am. This is unfair and unsafe. For this reason, I have asked any children at school early to sit quietly and pray in the church and wait until the gates open.

Lately I have noticed some of the children gathered and sitting on the sidewalk and kerb outside on Wellgate Ave. I have concerns about their safety here. PLEASE, if you need to drop your child before the gates open, OOSH is available. At the very least, speak to them about the expectation of waiting quietly in the church. Either way, there is no supervision by the school before 8.20am.

I thank you for your understanding and cooperation in the interest of your child's safety.
