#### Your children are in good hands -

This is a commitment that the staff are happy to do because they see the educational value in the activity.

Finally, the 'face' of the school are our wonderful office ladies. They are always there to greet you with a smile when you enter the office. They are there to comfort children and offer First Aid if there has been an accident or an illness, or if a child has forgotten their lunch. They are there to accept cakes and treats for birthday celebrations, or to greet you when you sign in as visitors to the school. They are always calm and answer your calls or queries with a smile.

I know how lucky I am to lead such a dedicated team of staff who show the face of Christ to the children in their chosen vocation. Being a teacher involves so much more than teaching. Do you agree? #### Sunday, 27 August 2017: Gospel Reflection Week 7 (Mt 16:13-20)

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

You are Peter, to you I will give the keys of the kingdom of heaven.

When Jesus came to the region of Caesarea <u>Philippi</u> he put this question to his disciples, 'Who do people say the Son of Man is?' And they said, 'Some say he is John the Baptist, some <u>Elijah</u>, and others <u>Jeremiah</u> or one of the prophets.' 'But you,' he said 'who do you say I am?' Then Simon Peter spoke up, 'You are the Christ,' he said, 'the Son of the living God.' Jesus replied, 'Simon son of <u>Jonah</u>, you are a happy man! Because it was not flesh and blood that revealed this to you but my Father in heaven. So I now say to you: You are Peter and on this rock I will build my Church. And the gates of the underworld can never hold out against it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven: whatever you bind on earth shall be considered bound in heaven; whatever you loose on earth shall be considered loosed in heaven.' Then he gave the disciples strict orders not to tell anyone that he was the Christ.

#### Gospel Reflection

The question that Jesus asks the disciples is a question he asks of all of us. How we answer that question reflects our relationship with Jesus. But more importantly, how we answer that question reflects the way we live our life in response to who we believe Jesus to be. If we truly say that we believe in Jesus as the son of God, then how do we live our lives in such a way that we act on that belief? The gospel shows us that an inadequate answer to that question leads to missing the point of all that Jesus is. (Liturgyhelp.com 22-8-2017)

May he also keep us faithful to our Lord Jesus Christ forever and ever. Amen"*

For this event, we ask for the help from the **Year 1 and 6 families** to set up, BBQ, serve and clean up on the day to help this morning run smoothly.

Reminder: Under no circumstances are parents to approach any student directly to resolve issues or concerns arising from school matters. It is important that these matters are dealt with through the appropriate channels at school, via classroom teachers and school leadership. I thank you for your cooperation on this matter!

#### Afternoon Pickup

A reminder that students being picked up after school must wait in the 'parent pick up area' and parents need to drive through the car park or park in one of the adjacent streets, or at the ovals across the road, and collect your children from there. Recently, children have been waiting <u>outside</u> the front of the school near the bus stop and getting picked up there. **THIS IS A NO STOPPING AREA** and the rangers will be booking anyone that stops there to collect their child. This only adds to the afternoon congestion and compromises the safety of all children. Please help

us in ensuring the safety of your children. A copy of the new council fines is attached.

#### Medical

If your child is feeling unwell, either with a slight fever, feeling sick in the stomach, cough etc, could we please ask that you keep them at home. Between the flu epidemic and gastro bug, we have had quite a few staff away, and have had many children in sick bay with all of these symptoms and with the current weather conditions, we need to try to limit the spread of germs. Your understanding and consideration with this is appreciated.

#### **IMPORTANT**

School Leave of Five Days or More

It is very important if you are going to take your child/ren out of school for five days or more that the Application for Exemption Form is completed. We will then issue you with a signed Certificate.

#### This is a government requirement.

We have had several cases recently, particularly through the government census period, where this has not been done and therefore, we do not have the necessary paperwork for when we are audited. The Application for Exemption form can be found on our website.
