Dear Parents,

I asked a class of Year 6 students once what they thought this moment would be. I was astounded that a couple identified this as the moment of death. Indeed, our moment of death is when we come face to face with God and, therefore, must be our greatest.



POPE FRANCIS' FIVE FINGER PRAYER





- 2.) THE NEXT FINGER IS THE INDEX. PRAY FOR THOSE WHO TEACH YOU, INSTRUCT YOU AND HEAL YOU. THEY NEED THE SUPPORT AND WISDOM TO SHOW DIRECTION TO OTHERS. ALWAYS KEEP THEM IN YOUR PRAYERS.
- 3.) THE FOLLOWING FINGER IS THE TALLEST. IT REMINDS US OF OUR LEADERS, THE GOVERNORS AND THOSE WHO HAVE AUTHORITY. THEY NEED GOD'S GUIDANCE.
- 4.) THE FOURTH FINGER IS THE RING FINGER. EVEN THAT IT MAY SURPRISE YOU, IT IS OUR WEAKEST FINGER. IT SHOULD REMIND US TO PRAY FOR THE WEAKEST, THE SICK OR THOSE PLACQUED BY PROBLEMS. THEY NEED YOUR PRAYERS.
- 5.) AND FINALLY WE HAVE OUR SMALLEST FINGER, THE SMALLEST OF ALL. YOUR PINKIE SHOULD REMIND YOU TO PRAY FOR YOURSELF. WHEN YOU ARE DONE PRAYING FOR THE OTHER FOUR GROUPS, YOU WILL BE ABLE TO SEE YOUR OWN NEEDS BUT IN THE PROPER PERSPECTIVE, AND ALSO YOU WILL BE ABLE TO PRAY FOR YOUR OWN NEEDS IN A BETTER WAY.

Gospel Reflection

Sunday, 12th March: Second Sunday of Lent-Year A (Mt 17:1-9)

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

His face shone like the sun.

Jesus took with him Peter and James and his brother John and led them up a high mountain where they could be alone.

There in their presence he was transfigured; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became as white as the light. Suddenly Moses and Elijah appeared to them; they were talking with him. Then Peter spoke to Jesus. 'Lord,' he said 'it is wonderful for us to be here; if you wish, I will make three tents here, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' He was still speaking when suddenly a bright cloud covered them with shadow, and from the cloud there came a voice which said, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; he enjoys my favour. Listen to him.' When they heard this, the disciples fell on their faces, overcome with fear. But Jesus came up and touched them. 'Stand up,' he said 'do not be afraid.' And when they raised their eyes they saw no one but only Jesus.

As they came down from the mountain Jesus gave them this order. 'Tell no one about the vision until the Son of Man has risen from the dead.'



Reflection

Matthew's Gospel this Sunday recounts the Transfiguration of Jesus on the mountain. Jesus reveals the Transcendent Truth of who He is in front of the human eyes of Peter, James and John. Jesus reveals who Peter, James, John and each one of us will become in Him. We are invited to embrace the mission of Christ and follow the path Jesus has prepared for us to guide us to the Kingdom of Heaven.

God's voice from the cloud claims Jesus as his Son, the Chosen One, and then goes on to instruct those present – and we, the readers – to 'Listen to him!' For the disciples, this was a message not to get carried away with their own ideas about the Messiah but to listen to what Jesus was saying about the suffering he must endure and to what he was saying about true discipleship. Jesus tells us that to be a follower of his involves sacrifice, hardship and often unpopularity. It is this message we must listen to as much as the promise of salvation.

What is Number Busting?

You may have heard your child talk about doing ‘number Busting’ during mathematics lessons. But what actually is number busting? Number Busting is the ability to partition a number (quantity) and reason about these quantities. Many students can read, write and order 2 or 3 digit numbers but struggle to ‘partition’ the number.

Number Busting is an activity that can be used to help children understand quantities of numbers. It allows children to manipulate a quantity to find that is made up of a variety of smaller quantities. It is important that children understand and attempt to ‘bust open’ a number in many ways.

Most children benefit from using concrete materials such as bead strings, to manipulate when busting a number but as the children develop their understandings of quantities we want to remove the need to ‘see’ the number and imagine the quantity.

Children use this knowledge to solve other mathematical problems.

Number Busting Challenge!

Try This!

Think of a number between 70 and 90 (smaller numbers for younger children, larger numbers or even fractions for older children).

Next, find as many ways as possible to split or partition this number in 2 minutes. Include some interesting or creative solutions. There is no limit to the number of splits. Avoid using the same operation every time.

Choose your favourite solution and explain why you have chosen it to a family member. Remember to do **HARD THINKING!**

Share your favourite number bust with your classroom teacher! Have fun!

Helping Your Child with Spelling:

- Using mnemonics to help memorise tricky words. For example, “There is a cess pit in necessary.”
- Finding words within words. For example, “There is a rat in separate.”
- Making links between the meanings of words and their spelling. For example, sign, signal, and signature.
- Using a dictionary as soon as they know how to.
- Encourage your child to have a go at spelling words they are unsure of. This will give them the opportunity to try out spelling strategies and to identify those that they find useful. You can help them to use the strategies outlined above and praise their efforts.



From the office.....

Absent Notes – If your child is away for any reason, an absent note must be sent to school on their return. This can be done either in writing to the teacher, by email to ola@parra.catholic.edu.au or by the skoolbag.app. It is a government requirement that the reason must be specific, not just family reasons, or family commitments.

Family Leave – If your child is going to be away for 10 days or more, then you need to complete an Application for Exemption form which needs to be submitted to the office, with a copy of your travel documents (eg flight details) and a Certificate of Exemption will be sent home to you. If it is less than 10 days, then a letter prior to leaving to the office/teacher needs to be sent in with the respective dates. Thank you for your attention to this matter.

Withdrawal from School – It is part of the CEDP Policy that a term's notice in writing must be given to the principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be payable. Please give as much notice as possible to avoid being charged.

Early Collection from School – If you need to collect your child early from school, please **DO NOT** ring the office and ask us to have them here waiting for you. We will only call for the children once you have arrived.

Book Covering – With the new library nearly completed, we have a lot of readers to be covered. If you can assist with this (contact is provided), please call into the office to pick up a bag of books.

Winter Uniform – Just for the new families at school, the students will go into their winter uniform in Term 2, Week 4, Monday 15th May 2017. Winter uniform will be available in the uniform shop towards the end of this term.

Kindergarten Siblings 2018 – If you have a child due to start kindergarten next year, please email the office with your child's name, DOB and the sibling's class and we will arrange for enrolment forms to be sent home to you in the next few weeks.
