Fourth Sunday of Lent Gospel Reflection (Jn 3:14-21)

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John
God sent his Son into the world that we might be saved through him.
Jesus said to Nicodemus:

'The Son of Man must be lifted up
as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert,
so that everyone who believes may have eternal life
in him.
Yes, God loved the world so much
that he gave his only Son,
so that everyone who believes in him may not be lost
but may have eternal life.
For God sent his Son into the world
not to condemn the world,
but so that through him the world might be saved.
No one who believes in him will be condemned;
but whoever refuses to believe is condemned already,
because he has refused to believe
in the name of God's only Son.
On these grounds is sentence pronounced:
that though the light has come into the world
men have shown they prefer
darkness to the light
because their deeds were evil.
And indeed, everybody who does wrong
hates the light and avoids it,
for fear his actions should be exposed;
but the man who lives by the truth
comes out into the light,
so that it may be plainly seen that what he does is done in God.'


GOSPEL REFLECTION

Walk Safely to School Day – 18th May 2018

Parent Library

Our school library has a shelf that holds a selection of great books related to parenting. The library will be open from 8.30 am on Mondays and Tuesdays and from 8.45 am on Fridays. Parents are welcome to drop in to browse and borrow books from this shelf.



From the office.....

Absent Notes – If your child is away for any reason, an absent note must be sent to school on their return. This can be done either in writing to the teacher, by email to ola@parra.catholic.edu.au or by the skoolbag.app. It is a government requirement that the reason must be specific, not just family reasons, or family commitments.

Family Leave – If your child is going to be away for 5 days or more, then you need to complete an Application for Exemption form which needs to be submitted to the office, with a copy of your travel documents (eg flight details) and a Certificate of Exemption will be sent home to you. If it is less than 5 days, then a letter prior to leaving to the office/teacher needs to be sent in with the respective dates. Thank you for your attention to this matter.

Withdrawal from School – It is part of the CEDP Policy that a term's notice in writing must be given to the principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be payable. Please give as much notice as possible to avoid being charged.

Early Collection from School – If you need to collect your child early from school, please **DO NOT** ring the office and ask us to have them here waiting for you. We will only call for the children once you have arrived.

Winter Uniform – Just for the new families at school, the students will go into their winter uniform in Term 2, Week 3, Monday 14th May 2018. Winter uniform will be available in the uniform shop towards the end of this term.

Head Lice – Head lice is a part of school life unfortunately. We have had a few cases of head lice in the school and so it is a timely reminder to check your child's hair for any eggs or lice and treat them accordingly. Please be aware that if we are aware of head lice at school, we will call parents to come and collect their child and treat their hair. They can return the next day, once they have been treated.

2018 Action Plans

All schools in the Parramatta Diocese are required to have Action Plans in the areas of Literacy, Numeracy and Religious Education. These plans are meant to be short, precise and "dynamically lived" documents (updated at the end of each term), which articulate the school's strategic work in the areas of Formation and Literacy and Numeracy. The School Action Plans are informed by school data with SMART Learning Goals (Specific, Measurable, Attainable, Realistic and Time targeted), for improving student learning outcomes. School Action Plans form the basis for the professional learning of teachers so that the learning of the students can improve.

In 2018, the Numeracy goal focuses on the children being able to use reasoning and fluency while communicating their understandings when problem solving. The staff will be undergoing further professional learning throughout the year to maintain this focus.

Early Years Assessment (EYA)

Over the next few weeks our students in Kindergarten, Year One and Year Two will participate in an Observation Survey of Early Literacy. These assessments inform the teachers and enables them to plan the teaching and learning experiences for our Infants classes. The assessments also help the school to identify vulnerable students for targeted intervention programs.

Helping Your Child with Spelling:

Children can find writing a real challenge. They need encouragement, support and praise for their efforts. You can best support your child by:

- encouraging them to write on every possible occasion, praising their efforts and, importantly, letting them see you writing whenever possible;
- playing word games with them, for example, I spy, Scrabble, Boggle and Find the Word puzzles;
- pointing to interesting or new words as you read to your child (without interrupting the flow of the story);
- composing emails together.
