

## **Gospel Reflection Sunday**

# **Sunday 24th February Gospel Reflection Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time-Year C (Luke 6:27-38)**

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke Be merciful as your Father is merciful.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'I say this to you who are listening: Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray



#### Gospel Reflection by Greg Sunter (LiturgyHelp.com)

In this passage we find one version of the Golden Rule that appears repeatedly throughout the gospels (as well as most other religious traditions): 'Treat others as you would like them to treat you.' It is followed up with a comment that it takes no effort to treat well people whom you like – anybody can do that. The challenge is to treat people you don't like as you would like to be treated yourself. In a society that had very strict rules about the way to treat different people and clearly established boundaries between different groups, this was a tough ask by Jesus. Bear in mind also that there was an occupying army in the country and Jesus was encouraging the people to treat even their enemies, the Romans, with love, compassion and forgiveness. This was a radical and challenging teaching!

#### **Prayer Bags**

This week each grade received their prayer bags to distribute to the children in their class throughout the year. Inside the prayer bags is an envelope for prayer intentions. Teachers have been inviting students to write prayer intentions in the class to add to the OLA prayer intentions book, presented at assembly each week. I would like to encourage families when their child brings home the prayer bag to write a prayer intention and place in the envelope to then be placed in the OLA prayer book. Pope Francis spoke at his weekly General Audience about prayer and described prayer with God is a silent with love. . . He concluding statement makes a connection with this Sunday's Gospel, "Jesus makes us pray, the Pope emphasised, even for those "who apparently do not seek God," because God seeks these people "more than anyone else." May we spend some time in prayer with God and be still and silent and enter into a private dialogue with God.

What is Positive Behaviour Support for Learning?



PBS4L is a whole school framework that helps us create positive learning environments for all students at Our Lady of the Angels.



The PBS4L framework is a research based and proactive school wide system that establishes clear behaviour expectations.

PBS4L plays an important role by helping to create positive learning environment for our students and teachers at Our Lady of the Angels. The process involves explicitly teaching and re teaching students how to enact positive behaviours.

This year the students will be involved in regular fortnightly lessons focusing on social skills related to our school agreements – Respect for Self, Others and the Environment. These agreements are taught, modelled and practised in different areas of our school each day.

Over the past few weeks we have been focussing on our playground behaviour expectations, after school dismissal procedures and how we walk around the school in two lines.

Below is what it looks to show our school agreements when playing at lunchtimes:

#### **Helping Your Child with Spelling:**

If your child is working on a class spelling list and can only remember half of the words, speak to their teacher. Don't tackle an entire spelling bar in one sitting. Take one-third for example, each evening, to work on with your child. Break the practice into small units. Try fifteen minutes of review when they get home; fifteen minutes before dinner; fifteen minutes after dinner. Shorter periods given frequently are more effective than one massive review-which is also exhausting and frustrating.

### From the Office....

Thank you to all parents for your patience during the first weeks of school. The office desk and phone is often at its busiest at this time of year and so we do appreciate your patience.

Just a few reminders:-

Notes/money for the Office - Each morning teachers will ask the children in their class if they have any notes or money. Teachers will keep any information they require and will send any other notes or money to the office via the class note bag. This system allows the office to receive notes and money without parents being required to actually come into the school. It also helps the children develop responsibility for passing on information. For those new to school life, if a note says, 'please return to the office' we mean for it to come through the notebag to the office. Thanks

<u>Change of Details</u> - It is <u>critical</u> that the school has up-to-date contact details for all students at all times. Please ensure that any phone, address or contact details that change are relayed to the office as a matter of urgency. It is most distressing for children and staff if we are unable to contact parents in the case of a child being ill or injured.

<u>School Emails</u> - Please be aware that since google upgraded their email accounts, we have had a lot of trouble deleting and adding parent email addresses. If you are not receiving emails from the school, can you please send us an email to ola@parra.catholic.edu.au.

<u>Visiting the School</u> - A reminder that during school hours, **ALL** parents, visitors and classroom helpers **MUST** sign in at the front office and collect a Visitors Sticker and then sign out as they leave the school, even if it is at the end of the day.

<u>Late/Early Leavers</u> - If your child is late for school or needs to be collected early, you must attend the office and fill out the Late/Early Leavers Slip. If your child arrives <u>at 8.50am or later</u>, you need to come into the office to sign them in. If there is a need to pick up your child early, please **DO NOT CALL THE**OFFICE to ask that your child is ready for when you get here. They will be called only when a parent has arrived to collect them. This is in the interest of minimising work in what is already a very busy office and in reducing the amount of lost learning time for your child. It is also recommended that appointments are made out of school time, wherever possible.

<u>Exemption for Leave Form</u> - If you are taking your child on holidays and they will miss 5 days or more from school, an Exemption for Leave Form **MUST** be completed prior to the leave and sent to the office. A certificate will then be completed and sent home. If notification is given either during or after the leave, then your child's roll will be marked as 'unexplained' leave.

<u>School Fees</u> - We have been advised by CEDP that there has been a problem with the printing of the school fee accounts. Hopefully this will be rectified next week and they will be forwarded as soon as possible.

<u>Medication</u> - If your child needs medication at school, new medication forms will need to be completed and given to the office. Please see us if you need to discuss anything, or you need the forms.

No medication is to be kept in your child's school bag.

#### Have you completed your Child Protection for Volunteers Training??

It has been heartening to see how many of our parents, grandparents, etc, have completed the Child Protection Training in anticipation of helping out at school. Whenever this is done, the school is notified by email and the names added go on a register to which we refer when someone wants to come into the school. The list is growing, thank you.

This includes helping at school in areas such as gross motor, lunches, reading groups, etc.


This must be completed every 2 years.

There are many benefits to having this app on your device:


- You may select to receive notification for your child's grade only.
