Dear Parents,

This Sunday is Pentecost Sunday, the day that is recognised as the birthday of the Church on earth. Before He ascended into Heaven, Jesus promised the disciples that He would send a helper to continue God's work, to bring about the Kingdom of Heaven, the reign of God, a world of justice and love. This helper, the Holy Spirit, came upon the disciples and Mary and gave them the gifts -knowledge, wisdom, strength, wonder, right judgement, courage and understanding – that enabled them to go out into the world and proclaim the good news. This good news (Gospel) is that our God is a loving and merciful God and that each of us, through Baptism, are invited into eternal life with Him.

God so loves us that His saving plan began immediately after the Fall of Adam and Eve. He asked Abraham to prepare the people for the Saviour. God sent His Son to be born human and die for us to bring the message of salvation to all. This message has continued to be passed on by the people of the church for over 2000 years. Today, it is we, members of the Catholic Church that, through our Baptism, are called to continue to bring this message to others in the things we do and say. At the end of each Mass, we are asked to 'go forth and spread the news' and continue Jesus' message and build a world of justice and love. The Old Testament taught us to love our neighbour. Jesus, in the New Testament, teaches us to love our enemy – quite a challenge.

Calling all parents and carers...one of the teachers commented to me the other day that one of the students said, 'I woke at 3am and couldn't sleep so I got out my iPad and played some games." !! Could this have been your child? Please note:

- Make sure your child has enough sleep each night there is a clear correlation between sleep and children's performance at school
- Allow them to have time to play! Be vigilant when it comes to the kinds of games they play and TV they watch no violence.
- Spend time playing, talking and interacting with your children
- Follow through with consequences they will learn that you can be trusted and your word is good
- Don't spoil them with too many material things allowing them to still get a thrill out of the little pleasures in life
- Look at them when they speak to you and listen be conscious of the 'other kids' interrupting and taking over; the message you could be giving is that the other is more important than them
- Don't do things for them (even when you're frustrated because they're taking too long) the message is they can't do it as well as you can.

Most of all **<u>be present</u>** for them!

...I thank you, the teachers thank you and, most importantly, your children will thank you.

Gospel Reflection

God speaks to us in many ways, including through the Sunday Scripture readings. We hear The Word and are given messages to to help us show the face of God.

Pentecost Sunday 9th June Gospel reflection (John 20:19-23)

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

As the Father sent me, so I send you: Receive the Holy Spirit.

In the evening of the first day of the week, the doors were closed in the room where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them. He said to them, 'Peace be with you,' and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord, and he said to them again, 'Peace be with you.

'As the Father sent me, so am I sending you.'

After saying this he breathed on them and said:

'Receive the Holy Spirit. For those whose sins you forgive,

they are forgiven; for those whose sins you retain, they are retained.'

Living the Gospel

'Come, Holy Spirit', or its Latin, Veni Sante Spiritus, has become the basis of countless prayers and hymns over many hundreds of years. To this day, it remains a powerful invocation that can be used in prayer or meditation. Three simple words convey a wealth of meaning. The invitation for the Spirit to 'Come' indicates recognition of the need for the Spirit's intervention and openness to accept the guidance that the Spirit brings. The Most Holy Trinity Sunday 19th May Gospel reflection (John 16:12-15)

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

Whatever the Father has is mine. The Spirit will receive what I give and tell you about it. Jesus said to his disciples:

'I still have many things to say to you but they would be too much for you now.

But when the Spirit of truth comes he will lead you to the complete truth, since he will not be speaking as from himself but will say only what he has learnt; and he will tell you of the things to come. He will glorify me, since all he tells you will be taken from what is mine. Everything the Father has is mine; that is why I said:

All he tells you will be taken from what is mine.'

Living the Gospel – Love is all around

Saint Patrick is famous for making the shamrock a handy tool to illustrate the Blessed Trinity: one plant, three leaves that are all connected and united – symbolising the one God, three persons that are all connected and united.

Sometimes close relationships are also compared to the Trinity: the person you love, the person who loves you, and God. If God is a part of your relationship, it's hard to think of the two of you without the power, joy and courage that God brings. The Holy Spirit brings the truth of God. Sometimes in our life we are running away from a truth, or trying to ignore or avoid it. Sometimes in our life, when we have done something wrong or when we are about to do something wrong, the Spirit of God speaks to us through our conscience. The main message of every Gospel is to know the way of the Spirit and to follow the way of the Spirit.

To participate in the competition, students compose an imaginative text of up to 500 words in length using the image above (eight different hats on display stands) as a stimulus.

Write On is an annual **writing competition** open to all NSW primary students in Years 1 to 6. It is designed to encourage students to develop their imaginative writing skills, and supports the teaching of writing. The competition aligns with the learning objectives in the NSW <u>English K–10 Syllabus</u>. The WriteOn 2019 writing competition closes in Week 10, Term 2 (5th July).

Imaginative pieces may include:

- narratives
- letters
- poems
- scripts for radio, screen and stage
- interviews
- journal entries.
