We have had a successful start to the term with online learning. A reminder once again that the priority are Literacy and Numeracy activities. Please do not hesitate to email if you require support or have any questions.

For Weeks 3 & 4 we will begin a gradual return to school as communicated and in line with Government COVID-19 guidelines. There will still be a single mode of learning, ie online, that will be completed by students on site and off site. Given the ever-changing Government directions in these uncertain times, we will communicate arrangements for Week 5 onwards closer to then. Please note that the following arrangements are flexible and may need to change.

At OLA we will gradually return in House Colour groups. If the day your house colour is allocated does not suit, please feel free to change to another day. (We kindly ask that you let us know via an email if that is the case.) Children who need to attend each day etc, as is currently the case, can continue to do so.

Monday - RED Colour House, plus children of essential workers/extras as is currently the case.

Tuesday - BLUE Colour House, plus children of essential workers/extras as is currently the case.

Wednesday – GREEN Colour House, plus children of essential workers/extras as is currently the case.

Thursday – YELLOW Colour House, plus children of essential workers/extras as is currently the case.

Friday – Children of essential workers/extras as is currently the case.

We hope that this approach will support parents by having all children from the one family attending school on the same day. As communicated, **we are here and open if you require to send your child to school.**

Once again, my appreciation for your patience and understanding as we work with the governing bodies to ensure a successful transitioning of the children back to school.

We are all certainly missing our OLA students and we hope we are all back together as soon as possible. Keep an eye out on your child's Google page on Monday morning for our next 'Hello' video from Mr Cauchi and myself.

As we are entering into our fourth week of Easter, as we work our way up to Pentecost. Last Week's Gospel, was the story of a 'Road to Emmaus'. Please note a significant change that we ask for your support in is that we would like to limit the number of parents/adults within our school grounds. This will adhere to social distancing rules for adults and in turn minimise any potential risk.

We would envisage that students are able to independently enter through the gates and venture to their classrooms. We encourage you to use the drive through for pickup and drop off. If you normally collect your child in person from the COLA, we now ask you to please wait outside the gates near the Statue of Mary (keeping social distancing in mind) and we will deliver the students to you. As kindergarten leave a little earlier, they may wait outside the main gate next to the office.

We also continue to ask that contact with the teachers is via email (to the school) or phone only as there will currently be no face to face meetings.

Attendance

As previously advised, the attendance code 'flexible' is being used for students continuing their studies at home. This approach will not negatively affect student attendance records and will continue during Term 2.

If your child is absent from their studies due to ill health or another reason, please let us know just like you usually do ie, email the school or the Skoolbag app.

Literacy News

PM e-Collection

A selection of e-books will be available for students on levelled readers. The e-Collection is digitised for use online, including iPads. The 350 titles cover the range of PM levels 1 to 30. Students will recognise recurring characters and discover favourite PM titles in an interactive format. Students will only have access to the titles in the levels that have been selected for them by their teacher. Students will receive a notification of their login details via their Google Classroom page next week. A parent guide on how to navigate through the site will be sent via email.

Write On Competition 2020



To participate in the competition, students compose an imaginative text of up to 500 words in length using the image above as a stimulus.

Write On is an annual **writing competition** open to all NSW primary students in Years 1 to 6. It is designed to encourage students to develop their imaginative writing skills, and supports the teaching of writing. The competition aligns with the learning objectives in the NSW English K-10 Syllabus. The WriteOn 2020 writing competition closes in Week 10, Term 2 (3rd July).

Imaginative pieces may include:

- narratives
- letters
- poems
- scripts for radio, screen and stage
- interviews
- journal entries.

Schools submit their best entry from each stage.

The entries are judged by a panel of experienced primary teachers from each sector.
