This Sunday 5th April is Palm Sunday, the Sunday before Easter. It marks the beginning of Holy Week. Palm Sunday is the day we remember Jesus riding into Jerusalem, being welcomed as our Saviour and King. The people celebrated Jesus' presence and shouted the day where the people cried out to Jesus, "Hosanna in the Highest! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!"

- Absentee notes can be completed on this app.
- Access to newsletters and news events linked directly to our school website.
- Instant notification when excursions are postponed, assemblies cancelled due to bad weather, delays during excursions and other important information.



Please ensure that you have updated your settings to receive the correct push notifications. You will receive alerts specific to the selected grade and all alerts sent as a whole school.
