# Living the Gospel – Christian

What does it mean to describe oneself as a Christian today? A common understanding might be 'one who follows the teachings of Jesus Christ'. Perhaps, based on the understanding of what it meant to be a disciple, we might better describe a Christian as one who learns from the teachings of Jesus and seeks to emulate the work of Jesus. That is, a Christian is someone who models their life on the example of Jesus and is the face of Jesus to others. That's a tougher job description than just turning up to church once a week or putting a bumper sticker on your car.

# Gospel Focus - 'Lord! Save me!'

The cry of Peter is one that each of us feels the need to cry out at some stage in our life. Jesus trusted Peter's ability to walk to him on the water; otherwise, he would not have called Peter to do so. It is Peter who doubts himself. In this moment of realising that he can't do it alone, he calls out to Jesus. One of the enduring images of Jesus is the one who saves – the Saviour. 
# Tell Them From Me Each year across the Parramatta Diocese, schools are

### **Email Addresses**

As most school notes are emailed, please don't forget to let us know if your email address changes. We encourage you to check your email (and/or spam) regularly for emails from OLA.

### **School Times – Late Arrivals**

School commences at 8.50am and concludes at 3.10pm.

If you arrive any time from 8.50am then you <u>must</u> bring your child to the office to have them signed in and they will get a late pass. We have had a lot of children recently who have come to the office unattended. We thank you for your co-operation in this matter.

### **Prescription Medication**

Prescription Medication is only administered to students upon completion of the OLA Medication Administration Form, which is available from the school office or on our website.

### **Non-Prescription Medication**

Non-prescription Medication will ONLY be administered by the school eg, Panadol, antihistamine, creams, eye drops etc, if they are accompanied by the Medication Administration Form. This medication will be sent home once the specified period is completed.

All medication for your child MUST be delivered directly to the office with completed paperwork and under no circumstances is any medication to be kept in a child's bag

# **Birthday Treats**

In regard to birthday treats that are sometimes sent in, we kindly ask that you refrain from sending anything in during this COVID 19 period. This is to ensure that children are only eating food that is supplied and/or prepared by you at home.

At this current time, we also kindly ask that you <u>do</u> <u>not</u> send in non-edible items as birthday treats eg, pencils etc due to COVID 19 as it is always unknown as to who has handled the items from manufacturer to classroom. This restriction is aimed solely at doing everything we can to ensure the safety of your child.
