Gospel Reflection: The feast of Pentecost celebrates the power of the Holy Spirit coming upon the disciples and energising them to set about their mission of continuing the ministry of Jesus. The gospel reading is one of the post-resurrection appearances by Jesus when he breathed the Holy Spirit upon the disciples. The actual events of that first Pentecost are recorded in the book of Acts and are recalled in this week's first reading. The use of this post-resurrection gospel account is a reminder that Jesus had already imbued the disciples with the Spirit but, as so often throughout his ministry, they were a bit slow to catch on to the significance of what he had done. It seems that they needed a more tangible experience to jolt them into action and Acts records the very physical experience of the Spirit entering their midst as a roaring wind before settling upon them as tongues of flame. Jesus had breathed the Spirit upon them but it took the roaring wind to make a real impression on the disciples. There are frequent references in the gospels to Jesus being 'filled with the Spirit'. It is this Spirit with which he was

filled that he breathed upon his disciples; it is that same Spirit that we receive sacramentally in Confirmation.

For the weeks following the death of Jesus the disciples had lived in fear and confusion, not fully understanding what had happened and not really knowing what to do. When they realised that the Spirit Jesus had breathed upon them was really present and urging them to action they finally had the courage to begin the mission that Jesus had entrusted to them: to spread the Good News of Jesus and continue to realise his message in the world.

**Living the Gospel:** 'Come, Holy Spirit', or its Latin, *Vene Sancte Spiritus*, has become the basis of countless prayers and hymns over many hundreds of years. To this day, it remains a powerful invocation that can be used in prayer or meditation. Three simple words convey a wealth of meaning. The invitation for the Spirit to 'Come' indicates recognition of the need for the Spirit's intervention and openness to accept the guidance that the Spirit brings. It is a powerful, simple prayer that can be used at the outset of any significant undertaking or whenever you find yourself in need of inspiration.

#### 24th May - OUR LADY HELP OF CHRISTIANS FEAST DAY this coming Monday

On the 24th of May, we celebrate the feast day of Our Lady Help of Christians. 'This is your mother.' Under the title of Help of Christians, Mary was chosen as Patroness of Australia.

Our Lady Help of Christians has been celebrated in Australia since 1844 but the history to this day dates back to the start of the 1800's. Australia has a special reason for turning to Mary because in the early days there weren't any priests sent to Australia and Mass was not allowed to be celebrated until 1820. In the early days, Catholics would gather to pray the Rosary to keep their faith alive. Catholic Australia remained faithful to Mary

and was the first nation to choose her under the title Help of Christians.

We thank the OLA parish for their kind donation of rosary beads for each student at OLA. To celebrate the feast day the students will be having a special prayer celebration in their grades and also saying a decade of the rosary all in honour of 'Our Lady Help of Christians.' Due to ongoing restrictions the children will also attend mass as a grade over the fortnight with a focus on the Devotion to Mary.

#### **SELECTION PROCESS TO REPRESENT OLA**


The process used for any representative team or gala day selection is indeed difficult and is sometimes met with controversy as children miss out on being selected. Disappointment follows and sometimes tears. The selectors rely on how the children perform at the selection trial (or trials depending on the time frame available). There may be players who feel (or perhaps are) better than other players selected but it is primarily the ability/skills etc the children display at the trial in front of the selectors that is crucial. Also important is the team player aspect and the right temperament/behaviour to represent the school.

Where we are able to submit many teams, we endeavour to allow a high representation of Year 6 children in their final year at OLA. If we are restricted by limited teams by the organisers then we endeavour to select the most competitive possible team combination from all of the children trying out. Please be assured that we undertake selections seriously considering many aspects but all times ensuring the process is fair and unbiased.

# PLEASE READ

#### **School Times - Late Arrivals**

School commences at 8.50am and concludes at 3.10pm. If you arrive any time from 8.50am then you must bring your child to the office to have them signed in and they will get a late pass. We have had a lot of children recently who have come to the office unattended. We thank you for your cooperation in this matter.

#### **Exemption Forms**

Please remember that an Application for Exemption Form MUST be completed at least three weeks prior to your child being away from school for five days or more.

This government requirement has now been in place for a few years and we are still getting parents advising us a day or two (or even the day of) before they leave for a vacation. If the certificate is not issued prior to you leaving, then your child's roll will be marked as an 'unexplained absence'. A note after the event does not suffice in this instance because the leave has to be approved by the principal prior to the holiday.

#### **Absence Text**

Please remember that if your child is away from school, you will receive a text message at 10.30am. Please click on the link and complete the information.

You must click on "Add Attendance Note" to submit your information as this will add your note to our system.

#### **Notification Policy if Moving from OLA**

If you are leaving OLA, please ensure you are aware that the Diocese requires a full terms notice (10 school weeks) in writing, to be given to the Principal before parents/guardians terminates a student's enrolment. According to Diocesan policy, if the required notice is not given, one term's school fees including diocesan fees are payable. Upon withdrawal of a student, fees are calculated on a pro-rata basis according to the notification period.

#### **Change of Circumstances**

If there has been a change of circumstances in your home ie moving house, parent separation etc could you please email the office to advise us of any new address/es, phone numbers, etc. All up to date information is required by CEDP so that we can all work in better partnership with you.

As most school notes are emailed, please don't forget to let us know if your email address changes. We encourage you to check your email (and/or spam) regularly for emails from OLA.


