FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT YEAR B

GOSPEL REFLECTION

This message is no better demonstrated than in this week's gospel passage. Jesus declares that, 'unless a wheat grain falls on the ground and dies, it remains only a single grain; but if it dies, it yields a rich harvest.' He is speaking of course about his own life, but he is speaking also to those around him and those of us who read the words today. Unless we are prepared to let go of our ego, our status, our 'reputation', for the sake of others and respond to them from the heart then we can never experience the breadth and depth of what it means to belong to a community. When we are prepared to let go of our hang-ups and reservations to make a difference in the lives of others then the 'harvest' that will be gathered from those actions will be great indeed!

Gospel Focus-New Love

Jesus says, 'Anyone who loves (their) life loses it; anyone who hates (their) life in this world will keep it for the eternal life.' This can seem pretty tough! It challenges us about how much we cling to the 'things' of this life. NAPLAN Practice Test

All schools participating in the NAPLAN Online in 2021 are expected to take part in a practice test during this coming week.

The Practice test is a trial-run and preparation for NAPLAN Online and will provide students with an opportunity to become familiar with the types of questions they will experience.

The practice tests include an omnibus test (combination of Reading, Conventions of Language and Numeracy questions) and a Writing test, both approximately 40 minutes in length. All students in Years 5, 7 and 9 are expected to complete both tests. Year 3 students will only participate in the omnibus test.

A reminder that all students in Years 3 and 5 will need headphones.

Literacy News

Ways to improve reading comprehension at home Help them decode words by reading aloud

An awareness of the letters and sounds words make and understanding how they blend together to make words and sentences is called decoding. When you read you determine what the words are and whether they make sense in a sentence. The only way to check how your children



decode, is to ask them to read aloud. This forces them to go slower, which gives them more time to process what they read, hearing the words as well as seeing the words on the page.

Find the right books

It's important not to set the bar too high. Generally, your child should recognize 90% of the words in the books they read in order to feel comfortable with the reading process. Stopping more often will interrupt the flow and will just confuse him or her as they try to focus on the overall meaning of the story. Obviously, also pick stories that interest them. It could be fairies, adventures, cars or Star Wars. We all prefer to read books about things we are interested in, so let your children do the same.

TECH TIPS

Online Safety Basics

Here are three key strategies to help you and your children safely navigate the digital world.

1. Be engaged, open and supportive

- Get involved. Share online time with your children as part of family life.
- Ask about their online experiences, who they are talking to and whether they are having any issues.
- Always reassure your child they can talk to you about their online experience.

2. Set some rules

- Set age-appropriate rules for devices and online access, with consequences for breaking them.
- Allow your child to have some input as this will help them understand the risks.
- Consider creating a family tech agreement
- Consider making some 'rules for parents' too — and stick to them! Model behaviour that you would like to see.

3. Get to know your device and its features

- Get to know the devices you and your children use and set them up for privacy and online safety.
- Take advantage of parental controls to monitor and control screen time and access to content in ways appropriate to your child's age and experience. <u>https://www.esafety.gov.au/</u>
