Thank you for your support

Covid numbers are high, and children are not immune from the Delta Covid strain. There have been many schools that have needed to close due to positive cases.

Maintaining the safety and wellbeing of our students and staff is the priority.

The Government is very clear that if children can stay at home, they MUST stay at home.

Please do everything you can to keep your children at home. This is the best and safest option and ensures your child does not come into contact with others outside their immediate family.

As communicated, children at school are supervised only. There are minimal teachers on site. Classroom teachers do not supervise the children as they are working remotely facilitating online learning.

If your circumstances change and you have no other alternative but to send your child to school you must fall into one of the approved categories, ie. essential workers, vulnerable students or those who have no other supervision options. Most importantly, prior to your child attending you are required to contact the school via email (if your child has already been regularly attending, this is not required). This is simply because, as you can appreciate, we only aim to have a very limited number of staff onsite for supervision purposes. Therefore, it is important that we are aware of how many students to expect.



Sunday 22nd August 2021 Gospel Reflection (Jn 6:60-69)

The decisions called for in today's readings are life decisions. The people at the time of Joshua had to decide which god they would worship. The disciples of Jesus had to decide if he was the one who would fulfill their messianic expectations. We have life decisions to make as well. How will we choose?


The choices we make determine the character of our union with God. God called us out of the slavery of sin and protected us throughout the journey of our lives. Jesus walked with us through the challenges of life and performed wonders for us. Why should we look elsewhere? Because we face new challenges. The new demands placed on us may be so great, or the commitment required of us may be so demanding that we feel that we can no longer walk with him. The church may be changing in ways we do not appreciate, or it may not be changing in the ways we believe it should, and so we may feel that we can walk with him no longer.

If we decide to commit ourselves, we will enter into a union with God that is deeper than anything we have previously known. However, this union will be based on faith. We may understand no more than we did in the past, things may be no more to our liking. But, 'to whom shall we go?' Jesus is God's holy one; he has the words of eternal life.



Thanksgiving, praise, peititon, intercession, penitence



Thanksgiving

A prayer of thankagiving is when we pray to God to thank him for the things we are most grateful for. This type of prayer is just a way to show thanks to God for blessing us with the many hings we must thank him for. We use this form of prayer when we eel the most grateful and when we eat.

Praise

We fail to walk on the right path and it is only just that we ask for forgiveness for that. Prayers of penitence is a chance for us to walk on the right path and to ratk for forgiveness.

Values Matter at OLA

How are values taught? Our Catholic schools have, at the centre of all learning and teaching, core Catholic values which are based on Christ's Gospel values. It is about making the core values explicit in all school activities through modelling, discussion and critical reflection.

This week we are focussing on the value of: Honest and Trustworthiness – Be honest, sincere and seek
the truth.

This value includes the following characteristics:-

- Being honest
- Being truthful to self and others
- Not deceiving, cheating or stealing exercising ethical judgments
- Being reliable doing what you say you'll do
- Having the courage to do the right thing
- Building a good reputation. Being loyal standing by your family, friends and country.

What you can do to promote trustworthiness:-

- Teach children the importance of trustworthiness by word and example. Ask yourself 'what message am I sending?" Avoid dishonesty, especially in front of your child ("A child's ticket, please, he is only 11.") Never ask your child to lie for you ("Tell Grandma I'm in the shower")
- Encourage honesty even when it may cause your child to get into trouble. Praise efforts to be honest and point out good examples whenever you see them. Express disappointment for dishonesty.
- Keep your commitments, be on time and do what you say you will do, especially when your child is involved.
- Teach that people need the courage to say 'no' when friends ask them to do something that seems wrong. Explain that it is disloyal to ask a friend to be untrustworthy.

Are you a good role model to your children? Do you model honesty and integrity at all times?

The overall message:-

Honesty and trustworthiness is about being honest, telling the truth, keeping promises, and being loyal so people can trust you. Trustworthy people don't lie, cheat or steal. They have integrity and the moral courage to do the right thing and to stand up for their beliefs even when it is difficult to do so.

Theme for the Week "Honesty & Trustworthiness"

Our theme this week encourages us to be honest and trustworthy at all times. To be honest with each other means expressing our feelings, respecting others and accepting responsibility for our actions. Being honest, sincere and seeking the truth are essential characteristics for being in harmony with ourselves and those with whom we interact.

Student Data Validation - Please update your contact details

On Monday 16 August you will receive an email or SMS (for those parents without email) from Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta (CEDP) asking you to review and, where necessary, update the key information they hold about your children currently enrolled in CEDP schools.

The purpose of this review is to ensure that CEDP has the right details to correctly identify and support students, including contacting families in an emergency or to share important updates.

Steps have been taken to ensure this process is as secure as possible to protect your information and your family's privacy. Your information is only accessed by authorised staff when it is necessary and in accordance with our Privacy Policy.

The link is **open until Friday 3 September** and I encourage you to complete the review/update as soon as possible to ensure that your family's correct details are on file. This is particularly important as Greater Sydney remains in lockdown due to the COVID-19 outbreak.

Only one person per family needs to complete the survey and it takes about 15 minutes to complete. If you have any questions or to seek help, please contact the CEDP Community Liaison Team on 9840 5796.

Literacy News - Book Week

Each year since 1945 the CBCA has brought children and books together across Australia through CBCA Book Week. During this time schools and public libraries spend one glorious week celebrating books and Australian children's authors and

illustrators. Classroom teachers, teacher librarians and public librarians create colourful displays, develop activities, run competitions and tell stories relating to a theme to highlight the importance of reading. You will often see parades with students dressed as their favourite book character. At OLA, we would like to celebrate "Book Week' next week. The teachers have planned many exciting activities for your children to complete. Happy reading everyone!

The Parramatta Diocese is running a **BookWeek@home-Book Parade**. Students, their families and book lovers everywhere are invited to 'dress up' part of their home so that letterboxes, windows, front yards and more come alive with settings, characters and scenes from their favourite stories. Students make their daily exercise a trip to 'old worlds, new words and other worlds' as they aim to spot book inspired displays around the neighbourhood. When the students see a display they like, they need to pop a note in their letterbox. Students need to tell the creators why they liked their display, or give a simple note of congratulations. 



