# <u>John 21:1-19</u>

**GOSPEL REFLECTION** 

You know I love you

You and I, like Peter, are enabled by grace to repent of our betrayals of Our Lord, some major, most mi claim: "Lord, you know that I love you."

But, this claim has to be evidenced by concrete action. In the case of Peter it was to feed and shepherd "my lambs, my sheep." What will manifest our professed love? In the words of Father Richard Rohr, it is *to love what God loves*.

Of course, we have to love our fellow human beings, but leaving it there would be inadequate. "For God so *loved the cosmos* as to give the Son." (Jn 3:16,17) So what must we do? Recall, Our Lord says elsewhere, "You are the Salt of the Earth." You must preserve the Earth so that it does not decay and so that it is a suitable habitation for all the creatures, including us, for whom the Earth is a common home. He went on: "You are the Light of the Cosmos." You are the enlightened mind and the enflamed heart of the whole cosmos, enabling it to understand its existence and to love God for it. We could pause for a moment to reflect on the words of Pope Francis: "We, the women and men of the Church, we are in the middle of a love story and each of us is a link in this chain of love. And if we do not understand this, we have understood nothing of what the Church is." (LiturgyHelp-Fr Michael Tate)

### Earlier this Week: ANZAC DAY - Lest We Forget

The Anzac tradition was forged 107 years ago on 25<sup>th</sup> April 1915, when the Australian and New Zealand Army Corps landed on the Gallipoli Peninsula.

It marked the start of a campaign which lasted eight months and resulted in some 26,000 Australia casualties, including 8,159 who were killed or died of wounds or disease. The bravery and spirit of those who served on the Gallipoli Peninsula shaped a legend, and so the 'Anzac" became a part of the Australian and New Zealand lexicon. In 1916, the first anniversary on the landing was observed in Australia, New Zealand, England and by troops in Egypt. That year, 25<sup>th</sup> April was named 'Anzac Day'. By the 1920's, Anzac Day ceremonies were held throughout Australia and the states had designated Anzac Day as a public holiday. Commemoration of Anzac Day continued throughout the 1930's and 1940's with World War II veterans joining parades around the country.

Over the ensuring decades, returned Australian Servicemen and women from conflicts such as Malaysia, Vietnam, Korea, East Timor, Iraq and Afghanistan as well as peacekeepers and veterans from allied countries, now march proudly in the parades.

They shall grow not old, as we that are left grow old; Age shall not wear them, nor the years condemn. At the going down of the sun and in the morning We will remember them.

This week we also celebrated an Anzac Day ceremony with the students. It was lovely to see parents joining us. A very special 'Thank You' to Wing Commander Tony Kay (Jonathan 2B) who gave generously of his time to address the children.

### Write On Competition 2022

To participate in the competition, students compose an imaginative text of up to 500 words in length using the image above as a stimulus.

Write On is an annual **writing competition** open to all NSW primary students in Years 1 to 6. It is designed to encourage students to develop their imaginative writing skills, and supports the teaching of writing. The competition aligns with the learning objectives in the NSW <u>English K–10 Syllabus</u>. The WriteOn 2021 writing competition closes at **4.00 pm on Friday 17 June** (Week 8, Term 2).

Students compose an imaginative text of up to 500 words using the image as the stimulus. Please refer to the judges' notes from WriteOn 2021.

Imaginative pieces may include:

- narratives
- letters
- poems
- scripts for radio, screen and stage
- interviews
- journal entries.

Schools submit their best entry from each stage.

The entries are judged by a panel of experienced primary teachers from each sector.

#### Assessment criteria

When assessing entries, judges use the following criteria:

- makes connections to the stimulus image
- engages the audience in imaginative, interpretive, emotive and/or creative ways
- maintains a consistent structure appropriate for the type of text selected
- uses a range of stylistic devices for the intended audience
- uses a variety of language forms and features, vocabulary and punctuation
- considers the purpose, audience and context
- includes age-appropriate content.

# Tech Tip Week 1-How to choose good online content?

Many children, whether under 5 or over 5, engage in screen time, whether they are video calling with family or friends, playing online games or watching their favourite programs. It is important to ensure they are getting the most out of it.

**The quality of your child's screen time matters!** Not all screen time is created equal. Some TV shows, games and apps are more appropriate for toddlers, preschoolers and kids than others. While it is important that screen time does not replace time spent in face-to-face play and communication, quality screen content can benefit children.

#### How to choose quality content

One tip for choosing good online content for children is to ask a series of questions about the app, game or program. It is likely that most will fit into one or more of the categories below. If the content does not fit into one of these categories, chances are it may not be as beneficial. Think about the concept of windows, mirrors and magnifying glasses when choosing good online content for your child/children.

#### Is it a window?

Does it give your child a view of something beyond their own experiences?

- Is your child learning something new, about for example, deep sea life, dancing, animals or dinosaurs or something else that interests them?
- Does it spark their imagination and interest?
- Does it inspire them to ask questions and make them want to learn more?

#### Is it a mirror?

- Does it reflect your child's interests and your values as a family?
- Are they extending an activity they already do offline like watching a video on how to decorate a cake, make a paper character or kick a goal in a soccer game?
- Does it include common games or scenarios that kids like to play or act out, such as doctors and patients, zoo or farm animals, pirates and treasure, cooking and baking?
- Does it include stories that have positive messages about friendship, being kind, taking turns or being polite?

#### Is it a magnifying glass?

- Does it provide opportunities for your child to explore the world?
- Are they learning a new skill like how to read, count, draw something or speak another language?
- Does it reward creativity, strategy and planning?
- Does it allow them to explore a physical space for example, an app that guides you around a zoo or an art gallery, or a map to help you navigate on a bush walk?
