NAPLAN practice Test

All schools participating in NAPLAN Online in 2022 will be taking part in a practice test during this coming week.

The practice test is a trial-run and preparation for NAPLAN Online and will provide students with an opportunity to become familiar with the types of questions they will experience.

The practice tests include an omnibus test (combination of Reading, Conventions of Language and Numeracy questions) and a writing test, both approximately 40 minutes in length. All students in Years 5, 7 & 9 are expected to complete both tests. Year 3 students will only participate in the omnibus test.

A reminder that all students in Years 3 & 5 will need headphones.

We 'BOUNCE BACK' at OLA

Students at OLA have been exploring the theme of empathy. Empathy can be described as the ability to step into the shoes of another person, aiming to understand their feelings and point of view, and to use that understanding to guide our actions. Empathy helps us to get along with people. Whether you

can be a good friend or be successful with a team of others depends on being able to understand how other people might see a situation and how they are feeling. It helps you know how your actions affect others, what actions you need to take to be a good friend or teammate, and it helps you understand more about the people and the world around you.

How can we encourage the development of empathy? Empathise with your child by acknowledging their feelings about different situations.

- Talk about others' feelings and suggest how children can show empathy.
- Read stories about feelings.
- Be a role model. By modelling respectful relationships and interacting with others in a kind and caring way, your child can learn from your example.
- Use "I" statements. 'I' statements can be used when speaking to children not just for children to use to express themselves. This type of communication models the importance of self-awareness.
- Validate your child's difficult emotions. Sometimes when our child is sad, angry, or disappointed, we rush to try and fix it right away, to make the

feelings go away because we want to protect them from any pain. However, these feelings are part of life and ones that children need to learn to 'bounce back' from. Naming and validating various feelings can actually help children learn to handle them.

• Use pretend play.

We ask that you continue this conversation at home to identify the need to show empathy towards others.

Tech Tip Week 8

Online Safety Basics from eSafety Website

Here are three key strategies to help you and your children safely navigate the digital world.

- 1. Be engaged, open and supportive
 - Get involved. Share online time with your children as part of family life.
 - Ask about their online experiences, who they are talking to and whether they are having any issues.
 - Always reassure your child they can talk to you about their online experience.
- 2. <u>Set some rules</u>
 - Set age-appropriate rules for devices and line access, with consequences for breaking them.
 - Allow your child to have some input as this will help them understand the risks.
 - Consider creating a family tech agreement
 - Consider making some 'rules for parents' too and stick to them! Model behaviour that you would like to see.
- 3. <u>Get to know your device and its features</u>
 - Get to know the devices you and your children us and set them up for privacy and online safety.

Take advantage of parental controls to monitor and control screen time and access to content in ways appropriate to your child's age and experience.
