
Thank you for your continued support. It is in partnership that we can achieve great things for our children.

TWENTY-EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME YEAR A (15.10.2023)

Gospel Reflection Matthew 22: 1-14

This gospel parable reflects the inclusive way in which Jesus lived his life. In many ways, Jesus was a scandal in his society because he didn't obey the social boundaries. He was very clear in being inclusive and attentive to those who were normally shunned. Today, those boundaries are just as clear and easily identified but the methods of excluding people have perhaps become a bit more subtle. Who are the 'shunned' and 'left out' in our society today? Where do the boundaries lie? Who would Jesus be reaching out to and seeking to include in today's society? This passage urges us not to be so caught up in the challenges of life that we fail to respond when God, the gracious and generous host, invites us to pause, sit down and enjoy the banquet prepared for us.



We thank you for your attention to this important matter.


OPAL CARDS
