






On Monday 'The Playground Craze' came to visit OLA. Kindergarten, Year 1 and Year 2 learnt about different feelings and emotions through the presentation titled 'The Happiness Habit'. Key messages from the performance included:

- Be yourself
- It is OK to experience different feelings
- How to 'Bounce Back' when things don't go your way

Years 3-6 learnt about the importance of online safety through the presentation 'The Highlight Reel'. Key messages from the performance included

- The positive and negative effects of technology including how it affects our physical and mental health
- How technology is a tool that needs to be used wisely
- Cyber-bullying, how to be kind online and strategies to stay cyber safe
- It's cool to be kind

The Zones of Regulation help students gain skills in thinking about their actions, which in turn leads to increased control and problem solving abilities. Learning activities at OLA are designed to help students recognise when they are in different states called "zones," with each of the four zones represented by a different colour. Students also learn how to use strategies or tools to stay in a zone or move from one to another. We also practise calming techniques and explore a toolbox of methods to use to move between zones. To deepen students' understanding the lessons set out to teach students these skills: how to read others' facial expressions and recognise a range of emotions, perspective about how others see and react to their behaviour, and when and how to use tools and problem solving skills.



#### **Technology Tip – Week 2**

#### Getting the most out of Gaming - Free Webinar for Parents and Carers

This free 45 minute webinar, offered jointly by the Council of Catholic School Parents NSW/ACT and the office of the eSafety Commissioner, provides families with strategies for supporting children and young people to have safe, positive experiences when playing games online. It is designed for parents and carers of children aged 7 to 14.



It will cover:

- When gaming can be beneficial and strategies to promote better in-game experiences

- How to keep children safe online - using safety and privacy settings in games and platforms.

- Strategies to promote more balanced gaming and how to create smoother transitions from game play to other activities.

- The key online risks and where to find help for things like bullying and harassment in games.

#### SELECTION PROCESS TO REPRESENT OLA
