PENTECOST SUNDAY YEAR A (28-05-2023)

Gospel Reflection (John 20:19-23)

The feast of Pentecost celebrates the power of the Holy Spirit coming upon the disciples and energising them to set about their mission of continuing the ministry of Jesus. For the weeks following the death of Jesus the disciples had lived in fear and confusion, not fully understanding what had happened and not really knowing what to do. When they realised that the Spirit Jesus had breathed upon them was really present and urging them to action, they finally had the courage to begin the mission that Jesus had entrusted to them: to spread the Good News of



Jesus and continue to realise his message in the world. Pentecost is called the birthday of the church because before Pentecost, there really was no church. Jesus had ascended back into the heavens, the Apostles were hanging around, scared and confused, and nobody knew what to do. Going out to baptise people and preach about Jesus was the last thing they had in mind because their lives would be in danger. But Pentecost celebrates the coming of the Holy Spirit – the force that turned a bunch of frightened, mixed-up folks into church. There was a rush of wind, tongues of fire, and then suddenly there was courage, knowledge, direction and commitment! Everyone started speaking and was understood, no matter what the language of the listener was! These were saints suddenly on fire with the Holy Spirit. Tech Tip Week 5

Is your child old enough for a smartphone?

At OLA some of our older children may have a phone for before and after school arrangements. All phones at school (during school hours) are to be kept in bags or at the office at all times, switched off or on silent and not to be used.

The right age for your child will depend on their level of maturity and your family routine. It is worth asking yourself the following questions before handing over a digital device.

Does my child have a good sense of responsibility?

- Are they able to stick to the rules?
- Do they show a good understanding of actions and consequences?
- Do they come to me or another trusted adult when they are distressed or if they encounter problems?
- What are the rules about when and where my child can use their smartphone? For example, will they only be able to use it while they are away from the house, and not in their bedroom at night.

Sometimes it may be best to start with a mobile phone without internet access, as children would only need to call in the afternoon etc, and only introduce a smartphone when they demonstrate an appropriate level of maturity. There are a range of mobile devices available that allow you to control which tools or services your child has access to.

We Bounce Back and Move Forward at OLA

Why should children learn to use 'I' statements?

"I" statements, also known as "I-messages," are a communication technique that can have several benefits in interpersonal interactions.

Encourage effective communication: "I" statements encourage open and honest communication. By expressing your own perspective, you create a safe and nonconfrontational space for others to share their viewpoints as well. This can lead to better understanding and resolution of conflicts.



Foster empathy and understanding: By using "I" statements, you express your emotions and needs in a way that allows others to empathise with you. It helps them understand how their actions or words impact you personally, fostering empathy and promoting a more compassionate response.

Facilitate conflict resolution: When conflicts arise, using "I" statements can help de-escalate tension and facilitate resolution. By expressing your feelings and needs without attacking or blaming others, you invite them to collaborate on finding mutually satisfactory solutions.

Enhance active listening: When you use "I" statements, you encourage active listening from others. By sharing your experiences and emotions, you invite them to genuinely listen and understand your perspective, which can lead to more meaningful and productive conversations.

These statements are encouraged to be used to express what has happened and how it made the individual feel. It also allows the child to suggest a possible resolution. Mastering an 'I' statement can take time. It is important that opportunities are given to children to practise using these statements in a variety of situations.

How can I construct an 'I' statement?

'I' statements allow children to name what happened, state how it made them feel and identify what they would like to happen next.

Example:

"I feel upset when I see that everyone else gets a turn on the swing, but I have to wait for a long time. I think it would be fair if we could take turns more evenly so that everyone gets a chance to play."

We are all capable of developing skills and strategies to 'Bounce Back' and build resilience. When faced with conflict, students at OLA are encouraged to...

- 1. Calm down by taking a deep breath, taking a break or thinking of something calming
- 2. Take turns speaking using 'I' statements
- 3. Agree on a solution

We ask that you continue this conversation at home to identify the strategies that work best for your child/ren. You may like to discuss the strategies that can be used at home and the different strategies that can be used at school.

Living Alongside our Neighbours

Changes to K-2 Student Reports





You may have noticed last week was the Indigenous round of football with the NRL.
