#### **CATHOLIC SCHOOLS WEEK**

This year we will once again join with more than 620 Catholic schools across NSW and ACT to celebrate Catholic Schools Week. There is so much faith, fun and learning that takes place each day at OLA that to fit it all in our Catholic Schools Week will be held over a two week period, from 5<sup>th</sup> March to 17<sup>th</sup> March. On 17<sup>th</sup> March we will have a special Catholic Schools St Patrick's assembly at 9.00am. We hope you can join us.

Additionally, this coming week (Week 7) we will once again have our termly "Family Week". Family Week sees the children have a break from formal home learning (although we ask that every child still reads each night) to spend time with you as a family or helping you for the family. You may choose an activity that you can do as a family each day with your child. Examples in the past have included playing UNO Flip, having some quiet time together, preparing a meal together, teaching the dog tricks, helping with your siblings, setting the table, telling 'dad' jokes, playing Connect4, reading mum or dad a book, washing the car, watering the garden, writing mum and dad a thank you note, spending time in prayer-saying the Rosary, going for a family walk etc. Family Week is aimed at freeing children up to assist and/or spend time with those who love them most, their greatest heroes, you their parents and family.

The theme for Catholic Schools Week across NSW for 2023 is 'Our Teachers Make the Difference'. It is a special time which encourages schools to showcase the many learning opportunities available to students and celebrate our unique Catholic schools.

Catholic Schools Week is about strengthening relationships between all those who have a stake in our schools – students, staff, families, priests, parishioners, and members of the wider community – showcasing what happens in our classrooms every day.



#### **Tech Tip Week 6**

#### **Tech Tips from eSafety Website**

#### **Online Safety Basics**

Here are three key strategies to help you and your children safely navigate the digital world.

#### 1. Be engaged, open and supportive:

- Get involved. Share online time with your children as part of family life.
- Ask about their online experiences, who they are talking to and whether they are having any issues.
- Always reassure your child they can talk to you about their online experience.

#### 2. Set some rules:

- Set age-appropriate rules for devices and online access, with consequences for breaking them.
- Allow your child to have some input as this will help them understand the risks.
- Consider creating a <u>family tech agreement</u>
- Consider making some 'rules for parents' too and stick to them! Model behaviour that you would like to see.

#### 3. Get to know your device and its features:

- Get to know the devices you and your children use and set them up for privacy and online safety.
- Take advantage of parental controls to monitor and control screen time and access to content in ways appropriate to your child's age and experience.

#### We Bounce Back at OLA


Students at OLA have been learning about using 'l' statements. These statements are encouraged to be used to express what has happened and how it made them feel. It also allows the child to suggest a possible resolution. Mastering an 'l' statement can take time. It is important that opportunities are given to children to practise using these statements in a variety of situations.

How can I construct an 'I' statement?

'I' statements allow children to name what happened, state how it made them feel and identify what they would like to happen next.

Example: 'When you took my pencil, I felt upset because it is my favourite pencil, so I would like it if you asked me before you used my pencil.'

Example: When you kicked the ball away from the game, I felt angry because it disrupted the game. I would like it if you played the game according to the rules.



Example: When you choose the game that we play everyday, I feel frustrated because I would like to play something different. I would like it if we could take turns choosing the game.

We are all capable of developing skills and strategies to 'Bounce Back' and build resilience. When faced with conflict, students at OLA are encouraged to...

- Calm down by taking a deep breath, taking a break or thinking of something calming
- Take turns speaking using 'I' statements
- 3. Agree on a solution

We ask that you continue this conversation at home to identify the strategies that work best for your child/ren. You may like to discuss the strategies that can be used at home and the different strategies that can be used at school.

- The capacity to cope and feel competent
- The ability to accept life's disappointments and bounce back from hard times
- A generally positive attitude to life
- A mixture of attitude, skills, abilities and characters

Some are born with a more resilient spirit, others have resilience fostered by early childhood experiences.

What does a resilient child look like?

Healthy thinking habits

Realistic/detective thinking

Bounces back from adversity

Has empathy for others

Helpful thinking Moves forward & doesn't dwell on what has happened

Being optimistic/positive attitude Good problem-solvers Independent and resourceful Abel to mix well with others

#### Children need the freedom to:-

- Grow up free from having to please their parents all the time (hopefully they will want to please you because of shared values)
- Be free to make their own mistakes (making mistakes is how we learn)
- Be free to feel discomfort and learn from life's disappointments.



#### If Getting a Haircut - Acceptable Hair Styles

"Hair is to be neat and tidy and off the collar, of consistent natural colour, of gradual even grade and extremes of fashion are to be avoided. Some examples that are unacceptable include: ridges, undercuts, steps, any excessive shaping with products, and any shaving cuts.

<u>Girls</u> hair that is longer than shoulder length is to be tied back from the face and eyes. Ribbons, hair clips etc should be school colours". <u>Girls</u> hair should be of consistent natural colour.


