

THE MOST HOLY TRINITY YEAR A (04-06-2023)



Gospel Reflection (John 3:16-18)

Trinity Sunday is an opportunity to celebrate the unity of God whom we acknowledge as Father, Son and Spirit. Every time we bless ourselves or begin prayer with the sign of the cross, we reaffirm our belief in the Trinity. That seemingly simple prayer, 'In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit,' is, in fact, a confirmation of our belief in a triune God – three in one. The earliest use of the sign of the cross only involved tracing a small cross with the thumb or finger on the forehead as it is still done in baptisms or blessings today. Later, describing the shape of the cross on forehead, abdomen and shoulders became the common practice. (Greg Sunter at Liturgyhelp.com)

Tech Tip Week 6 Time Online

Help your child achieve a healthy balance in their online and offline activities. How much is too much? There is no magic figure.

The right amount of screen time can depend on a range of factors like your child's age and maturity, the kind of content they are consuming, their learning needs and your family routine.

It can be easy to focus only on the clock, but the quality and nature of what they are doing online, and your involvement, are just as important.

Possible signs to watch for:

- less interest in social activities like meeting friends or playing sport
- not doing so well at school
- tiredness, sleep disturbance, headaches, eye strain
- changes in eating patterns
- obsession with particular websites or games
- extreme anger when being asked to take a break from online activity
- appearing anxious or irritable when away from the computer
- becoming withdrawn from friends and family.

Reducing your own screen time sets a positive example.

Active Listening

An important element of using 'l' statements is also <u>listening</u> to the 'l' statements of others.

Active listening is **paying attention to a speaker and listening to understand, not to respond**. It also includes complete focus on the speaker with minimal distractions out of respect and an intent to learn.

Using 'l' statements.

These statements are encouraged to be used to express what has happened and how it made the individual feel. It also allows the child to suggest a possible resolution. Mastering an 'l' statement can take time.

How can I construct an 'I' statement?

'I' statements allow children to name what happened, state how it made them feel and identify what they would like to happen next.

We ask that you continue this conversation at home to identify the strategies that work best for your child/ren. You may like to discuss the strategies that can be used at home and the different strategies that can be used at school.

Birthday Treats

We kindly ask that you continue to **NOT** send in any birthday treats of any kind, edible or non-edible. This is the ensure that children are only eating food that is supplied and/or prepared by you at home. **Continuing this practise at this time is aimed solely at doing everything we can to ensure the safety of your child, particularly as Covid is still present within the wider community.**
