

Maths News

Thank you to the many students who submitted their work to Mr Cauchi solving the maths tasks from last week. There was some excellent and creative thinking from our Kindergarten students all the way through to our Year 6 students. Please keep the responses coming.

Primary Learning Task

I am thinking of 2 numbers on the hundreds chart. One number is 15 more than the other. One of my numbers has a 3 in it.

What might my 2 numbers be? Give as many answers as you can.

Enabling Prompt

I am thinking of 2 numbers on the hundreds chart. One number is 5 more than the other. What might the numbers be? Find as many solutions as possible.

Extending Prompt

Convince me that you have found all of the possible answers for the main task. Describe any patterns that you see.

Infants Learning Task

The Three Pigs

The three little pigs have gathered sticks. Each of the little pigs has more than 10 sticks but less than 20 sticks.

They want to work out how many sticks each of them has.

How can they count their sticks quickly? Draw the sticks so they can be counted quickly.

Enabling Prompt

What if there was only one pig with more than 10 and less than 20 sticks. How many sticks could they have?

Extending Prompt

Each of the pigs have more than 15 and less than 30 sticks. How many sticks could each pig have? How many possible answers could there be? How many sticks do they have altogether?

Tech Tip Week 8

Tech Tip from the safety website.

Have you created a safe gaming environment for your child? Here are some steps to creating a safe environment.

Prepare:

Have computers and/or games consoles in an open area of your home. Activate parental and safety features on the device or in the app or browser.

Build good habits:

Protect their privacy online by using a screen name that do not reveal their real name. Use timers as signals that game time is nearly over to help them switch off.

Stay involved:

Talk regularly with your child about their gaming interests and who they play with online. Help them understand the risks.

Play alongside your child to get a better sense of how they are handling their personal information and who they are communicating with.

Monitor the time your child spends online and keep a look out for any changes in their activity, school, or social behaviours.

Be aware of what they are playing.

We Bounce Back at OLA

Students at OLA have been exploring the theme of empathy. Empathy can be described as the ability to step into the shoes of another person, aiming to understand their feelings and point of view, and to use that understanding to guide our actions. Empathy helps us to get along with people. Whether you can be a good friend or be successful with a team of others depends on being able to understand how other people might see a situation and how they are feeling. It helps you know how your actions affect others, what actions you need to take to be a good friend or teammate, and it helps you understand more about the people and the world around you.

How can we encourage the development of empathy?

- Empathise with your child by acknowledging their feelings about different situations.
- Talk about others' feelings and suggest how children can show empathy.
- Read stories about feelings.
- Be a role model. By modelling respectful relationships and interacting with others in a kind and caring way, your child can learn from your example.
- Use "I" statements. 'I' statements can be used when speaking to children not just for children to use to express themselves. This type of communication models the importance of self-awareness.
- Validate your child's difficult emotions. Sometimes when our child is sad, angry, or disappointed, we rush to
 try and fix it right away, to make the feelings go away because we want to protect them from any pain.
 However, these feelings are part of life and ones that children need to learn to 'bounce back' from. Naming
 and validating various feelings can actually help children learn to handle them.

Use pretend play.

We ask that you continue this conversation at home to identify the need to show empathy towards others.
