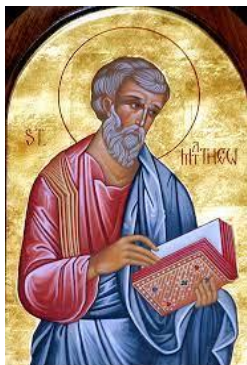

## Supporting and Extending your Child's Learning

Over the next few weeks, the teachers will extensively assess your child so as to get to know their strengths and areas of need. They will also read each child's file and reports so as to get a better perception of their past performance and successes. It is important to have a good understanding of each child's needs before launching into the programming of work, so that it meets these needs.

Please return the Student Information form that you picked up when dropping your child off for assessments no later than Friday 10<sup>th</sup> February so that your valuable input can be utilised to assist your child.

## Meet & Greet – Parent/Teacher Meetings

Once again, this year we would like to strengthen our partnership and communication with you by meeting very early in the year for a short 10-minute parent/teacher meeting.

This interview is very much a meet and greet, allowing you to put a face to your child's teacher and to further discuss your child's learning needs and goals. These sessions for Years K-6 will take place in Week 4 on Monday and Wednesday afternoons.

Many thanks to the teachers for generously giving up their time out of school hours to meet with you.

Today you would have received an email to book these interviews online. We ask that you complete it as soon as the portal opens. We encourage you, if you wish, to have your child with you when you connect with the teacher so that they can be part of the conversation.

## Birthday Treats

We kindly ask that you continue to **NOT** send in any birthday treats of any kind, edible or non-edible. This is to ensure that children are only eating food that is supplied and/or prepared by you at home.

**Continuing this practise at this time is aimed solely at doing everything we can to ensure the safety of your child, particularly as Covid is still present within the wider community.**

## School Hats

OLA has a "NO HAT, NO PLAY" policy

Please ensure your child has their school hat with them each day to assist in promoting sun safety and awareness in your child/ren. Any child not wearing a school hat at play times will need to play under the sheltered areas. Please ensure that your child's hat is clearly labelled.

## SRC Representatives

There will be two SRC members for each class in Years 1-6 elected for the first semester (Terms 1 and 2) and another two SRC members elected for the second semester (Terms 3 and 4). There will be a boy and girl SRC member each semester. The presentation of SRC badges will take place at a SRC presentation assembly on Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> February at 9:00am and then in Term 3 on a date to be advised. Parents of successful candidates will be advised beforehand and invited to attend the short assembly if they wish. Kindergarten will have two SRC members for the second semester only (ie Terms 3 and 4).

The process for nomination of SRC will commence soon. Teachers will advise the students when nominations will occur. Students wanting to nominate themselves are required to present a one to two minute (max) speech identifying why they would like to be class representative and the qualities they can bring to the role.

### Our School is a Nut Aware School Community

At Our Lady of the Angels School, we have children who have severe allergies to nuts. While allergic reactions are common and most are not serious, for these children the reaction can be life-threatening. This is called anaphylaxis and can occur in minutes of an exposure to a trigger, in these children's case, nuts.

We see prevention as a major part of providing a safe environment for these children. So as to support our community's effort in this regard, parents are requested not to send nuts or foods containing nuts to school with their children.

The following list gives examples of such foods:-

- Peanuts, hazelnuts, almonds, cashews, macadamia nuts
- Peanut butter
- Nutella
- Biscuits and cakes containing nuts
- Snack packs containing nuts
- Chocolate bars containing nuts, eg Picnics, Mars Bars (almond), Nut Breaks and Fruit & Nut Chocolates
- Marzipan and nougat
- Muesli bars and snack bars containing nuts
- Yoghurt and nut mixer packs
- Confectionery items such as Lolly Gobble Bliss Boms and Rocky Road
- Uncle Toby's yoghurt museli bars

We realise that there may be trace elements of nuts in a variety of other foods. However, if you use the above list as a guide you will be doing your part. Parents can also reinforce with their children that sharing food is not allowed at OLA.

## School Census Day - Friday 10<sup>th</sup> February

Friday 10<sup>th</sup> February is the school census day.

This is of course a requirement that applies to everyday of the school year, however Census data is directly related to Government funding for our schools and the requirements outlined above are set by the Department of Education. Thank you for your co-operation.

### Tips to help your child develop fine motor skills for successful handwriting

In order to support handwriting development, teachers engage students in a range of fine motor activities to strengthen hand muscles.

#### Encourage your child to develop fine motor skills by:

- using their fingers to draw and build in sand
- using a range of pencils, crayons and markers to draw and make patterns
- using play dough and clay to create shapes and patterns
- drawing patterns in the air
- playing with pegs and helping to hang out washing
- playing games that involve tweezers or tongs
- threading activities such as beads and string • craft activities involving cutting and sticking.

### Starting to form letters

In the early years, students develop basic skills of writing, including correct pencil grip, good posture and handwriting movements, using a thicker pencil.

#### Teachers support students to learn correct letter formation by building skills in a sequence, including:

- drawing a range of shapes such as straight lines and circles
- exploring patterns such as a soft wave or pointed peaks
- having students write over a highlighted letter, with a dot to show where to start
- writing the letter using a letter outline with a starting dot
- writing the letter using a starting dot on a line
- writing the letter in dotted lines.

#### Source:

**Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC)** aims to encourage a love of **reading** for leisure and pleasure in students and enables students to experience quality literature. The **challenge** encourages students to **read**, to **read** more and **read** more widely. The **2023 NSW Premier's Reading Challenge** will be launched on **27th February** this year and further information can be found on the [PRC website](#). **Students will receive their login details in the next two weeks.**

### 2023 Challenge dates

Students can include any books read from the end of the 2022 challenge on their 2023 reading record. Key dates for the 2023 challenge are:

**27 February 2023** - challenge opens for student entries

**Friday 18 August 2023** - challenge closes for student entries

**Friday 1 September 2023** - final date for coordinator validations of completed reading records. The PRC rules have been updated for the 2023 challenge. Students can now include up to 10 choice books on their reading records, and can count 5 books from an approved series as PRC books. Please refer to the rules page for more information about the 2023 PRC rules.
